Narrative Description of Facility Capabilities & Functions: Functions as the primary site for news media activities at the Kennedy Space Center (KSC); countdown clock marks time to liftoff; clock and flag pole flying United States flag comprise optional media foreground during countdown sequence and liftoff(Anon 1994:37; NASA 1992:6.1, 7.24).

Most news media activities at KSC occur at the Press Site. On an elevated area south of the Vehicle Assembly Building and adjacent to the Barge Terminal Facility, NASA/KSC leases space to television news, radio news, newspaper wire services, and other media concerns. Some media, such as ABC, CBS, NBC, CNN, AP, and Westwood One, maintain permanent facilities at KSC. Leases within the Press Site area allow these firms to transmit news coverage from their own facilities. Across from the covered grandstand which seats 350 people, and beyond the speakers' platform, are the clock and flag pole. The special purpose clock marks time to liftoff. Although the interior clock mechanism has been changed, the exterior of the clock, with a digital readout, is original to the Apollo era. The standard-sized metal flag pole is also original to the Apollo era. The seats of the grandstand and the media cameras face the launch pads with the countdown clock and flag pole in direct sightline of the launch. That careful positioning enabled every broadcast of a launch to feature the clock and flag pole flying the United States flag during countdown and liftoff. Consequently, these objects are directly associated with the space program in the collective mind of the public which witnessed the worldwide broadcasts (Anon 1994:37; NASA 1992:6.1, 7.24).

Narrative Statement of Significance Press Site: Clock and Flag Pole

The Press Site: Clock and Flag Pole contribute to the Historic Cultural Resources of the John F. Kennedy Space Center, Florida, under the historical context Apollo Program 1961-1975 and each of its three subcontexts under property type F.4, Broadcast Facilities. They are significant at the national level under NRHP Criterion A in the area of space exploration and communications. Because these objects have achieved significance within the past 50 years and are of exceptional importance in the areas of space exploration and communications, Criteria Consideration G applies. In addition, the Clock and Flag Pole largely retain their integrity of design, materials, workmanship, feeling, setting, location, and association.

Media audiences were able to simultaneously view the Launch Vehicle and clock, watching with anticipation as it counted down to liftoff. The Saturn vehicles were often framed during liftoff between the countdown clock and the United States flag flying from the adjacent pole. Therefore, the clock and flag pole are historically associated with Apollo era launch procedures in the minds of people worldwide. United States Department of the Interior National Park Service
