Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Levy House sits on a 50 by 140 foot lot in the Florence Place Subdivision. The landscaping is informal. The house itself is a one story, stucco, 3 by 4 bay Spanish Revival structure. The main house is a gable roof to the sides structure with rear gable ell off the south end and a parallel parapeted gable at the north elevation, serving as the kitchen. There is an exterior chimney at the south end of the gable. Then central entrance is shielded by a flat roof, parapeted stucco porch with buttressed stucco supports. The deck is tile. To either side of the porch the deck continues on grade, there is a square stucco planter at each corner of the facade with ironwork railing between. The entrance includes a multi-light door with sidelights. Casement windows are set in arched panels.

The interior plan is irregular. There are hardwood floors, sheetrocked walls and ceilings, two panel doors with pressed glass knobs and transoms and baseboards. There is a hall in the center with rooms and doors leading into the various rooms. The kitchen and bath retain their original fixtures.

Integrity

The Levy House retains its integrity of location, style and design. There are no significant interior or exterior alterations.

CRITERION C: ARCHITECTURE

The Levy House is significant under National Register Criterion C as a typical middle class example of the Spanish Revival style. Built in one of Mobile's developing suburbs in 1927, the house exhibits classic elements of the style including stucco construction, parapeted rooflines and sophisticated tilework on the porch deck.

Florence Place was platted in 1926 by George Fearn and Son. Early attempts to require an all Spanish Revival neighborhood were defeated by the Depression. 107 Florence Place was built in 1927 for George Levy, a Mobile cotton buyer. The house has since passed through a number of owners but remains in good condition.
