DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The J. H. Hopffgarten residence is a large two-and-one-half story frame house in the Georgian Revival style. The design is symmetrical and the facade is spanned by a one-story porch which central bay window. A two-story central pedimented portico with Doric columns was added when architects Wayland & Fennel remodeled the dwelling around 1922. The tiled, hipped roof displays wide, flared eaves which show a Queen Anne influence from the original structure. A unique "eyelid" window in the pediment further ornaments the home.

The original residence was a simple two-story frame house built around 1899 by assay clerk Albin de Mary. The building underwent several minor remodelings after it was purchased by J. H. Hopffgarten in 1915. Its present Georgian Revival style was achieved under Mr. Hopffgarten's direction.

Due to the fact that the central portico was added after the original construction, it frames a bay window rather than the entry, which is right of center. The front porch was extended to wrap around the house and later enclosed on the left side; rooms were added to the rear. The large two-story portico addition was the last major change.

The interior of the Hopffgarten house remains relatively unchanged since the 1916 and 1922 remodelings. The first floor rooms have handsomely carved pine woodwork hand-grained to imitate mahogany. Two Ionic columns stand on opposite sides of the front parlor. A low wainscot is decorated with a landscape mural in brown tones painted by J. H. Hopffgarten. The dining room has a hand-grained wainscot resembling marble. The vestibule has an open staircase with carved pine newell posts and smoothly turned spindles also painted to look like mahogany.

Extensive landscaping is found on the property, including two fish ponds, a fountain and a stream. A large hedge surrounds the property and two river rock pillars flank the entrance on Boise Avenue. Numerous mature trees enhance the property.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Hopffgarten house is significant to Boise's architectural heritage in that it is one of the last of the large, fine dwellings which once distinguished Boise Avenue in the village of South Boise. Painter J. H. Hopffgarten (owner of the Hopffgarten Sign Company) purchased the house in 1915 and painted landscape murals, which still remain in the house. He remodeled the plain frame house to recall the Georgian motifs of the elegant residences of his state. The Hopffgarten family resided in the house for 60 years and it retains their name, even though they were not the original builders.

J. Harry Hopffgarten (1883-1975) was born in Augusta, Georgia and spent most of this youth in Atlanta. At the age of fourteen he began to learn the business of sign-writing, then was in this business in Atlanta, Savannah, and Columbus, Georgia; Tampa, Florida; and Spokane, Washington. In 1904 he came to Boise and founded his own business: Hopffgarten Advertising Sign Company. He quickly became one of Boise's well-known, successful businessmen. Hopffgarten expanded his business to include billboards and advertisements painted on walls of buildings.

This aspect of his work extended beyond Boise to other parts of Idaho, Oregon, and Washington. At one time in his career he had part ownership in the original Northwestern United States Coca-Cola dealership, and painted advertisements for the product on sides of buildings. Hopffgarten also painted elaborate advertisements combined with landscape scenes on Boise theatre curtains.

The house sits on an exceptionally large piece of residential land (two acres), unusual in this part of Boise, which is experiencing dramatic growth. When the house was built, South Boise was predominately an agricultural center with a number of substantial residences belonging to pioneer families. Most old South Boise homes were small and modest. Structural evidence of the contrast, between these early ordinary homes and a few mansions, still remains in this area of recent development. The Hopffgarten house is a superior example of these more elegant buildings.
