

It is a reasonably well preserved example of the Form/Plan Type as shown

and more fully described herein. As such, it is included in the Thematic Nomination to the National Register of Historic Places for the Early Stone Houses of Bergen County, New Jersey.

The first Westervelts landed in New Amsterdam from the Dutch West India ship Hoop (Hope) on May 24, 1662. They first settled on Long Island, but in 1676 Lubbert Lubbertsen Van Westervelt sold out and moved to Hackensack. The builder of the present house, Peter Westervelt, was a descendant of Lubbert; he was a carpenter by trade. The so-called Westervelt house was built for Henry DeMott whose daughter Fransiney Peter Westervelt later married. The marriage took place in 1810 at the time the frame wing was added; the house was inherited later by them and has been known since as the Peter Westervelt house. Their granddaughter Margaretta Westervelt is the present [at time of HABS] owner and [occupied] the house [in 1936].
