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#### **SUMMARY PARAGRAPH**

Kenwood Historic District is an approximately 375 acre residential area that contains a variety of residential architectural styles that include Frame and Masonry Vernacular, Craftsman Bungalow, Minimal Traditional, Tudor Revival, Mediterranean Revival, Colonial Revival, Ranch, Prairie, American Foursquare, Dutch Colonial Revival, Mission, and International. The district consists mainly of one-story and two-story single-family dwellings constructed between 1913 and 1953. Most of the primary residences have outbuildings, such as garages, garage apartments, and separate apartment structures. There are also a few small commercial buildings in the area, and five churches. Of the 2,433 buildings surveyed, 2203 are contributing and 178 are noncontributing, a ratio of approximately 93 percent contributing to 7 percent noncontributing. There are a high number of relocated houses in Kenwood, 167 dwellings in all, most them Craftsman/Bungalows moved during the early to mid-1930s from Central Avenue and other St. Petersburg neighborhoods (Neighborhood Partnership Office 1998:n.p.).

#### **SETTING**

Kenwood Historic District is a neighborhood located slightly northwest of downtown St. Petersburg. The land that makes up Kenwood is located on a plateau that is generally 50 feet above sea level, while most other areas of the City are 25 feet above sea level. Immediately south of Kenwood Historic District is the Central Avenue commercial area. West of the neighborhood is another commercial area along U.S. 19. Interstate 275 forms the eastern boundary of the district. Beyond the eastern boundary are light industrial and commercial uses. Beyond the northern Kenwood Historic District boundary are mixed residential, commercial, and institutional uses as well as the North Kenwood neighborhood, which contains a large number of buildings that may not be 50 years of age or older or may not maintain a high degree of historic physical integrity. Therefore, the North Kenwood neighborhood is not considered eligible as an NRHP-eligible historic district.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

Kenwood developed as an early middle- to working-class neighborhood northwest of the central downtown area. As one of the earliest areas to be developed outside of downtown, it grew as a result of the popularity of St. Petersburg. St. Petersburg rapidly developed in the decade before the Florida Land Boom of the 1920s because it was a favorite vacation destination (Arsenault 1988:143-147). Developers such as Perry Snell and Charles Hall were attracted to the area as a result of visiting here. The area that makes up Kenwood Historic District was first platted in 1912 with Hall's Central Avenue #1 and Hall's Central Avenue #2 subdivisions.

While a few houses were constructed during the 1910s, the development reached its zenith during the Land Boom era of the 1920s. The area's location approximately two miles from St. Petersburg's downtown

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core, was ideal with its easy access to downtown by automobile or streetcar. At one time a streetcar system that was constructed in 1905, called the St. Petersburg and Gulf Railway, ran along part of Central Avenue and eventually extended over time to reach the Boca Ciega Bay. The trolley system played an important role in the expansion of the city, linking the downtown with outlying areas. The system was very popular until 1947, when the outdated trolleys from the early 1900s were eventually phased out (Arsenault 1988:310). The streetcars helped link Kenwood and other neighborhoods that developed along Central Avenue to downtown. Historically, Kenwood stretched from 9th Avenue North to 5th Avenue South between 22nd and 25th Streets (St. Petersburg Investment Company Subdivision) and to 1st Avenue South between 28th and 31st Streets (Hall's Central Subdivision #2). Between 20th and 27th Streets the boundary ended at 1st Avenue North. The west boundary ended primarily at 31st Street, but extended to 34th Street between 5th and 9th Avenue North. The east boundary ended at 19th Street. The commercial district historically centered along Central Avenue. Today, the southern, eastern, and western boundaries have been encroached upon by modern commercial development. Currently, many houses along 1st Avenue North have been converted to commercial uses, and modern commercial infill exists along this corridor as well.

Fourteen subdivisions comprise what is now known as Kenwood. The fourteen plats that comprise the historic district are: Hall's Central Avenue #1 (1912), Hall's Central Avenue #2 (1912), St. Petersburg Investment Co. (1912), Sunshine Park (1912), Kenwood (1913), Bronx Addition (1921), Addition to Kenwood (1924), School Park (1924), Brunson (1924), Royal Palm Park (1924), Chevy Chase (c. 1925), Deeb (c. 1925), High School Addition (c. 1925), and St. Petersburg High School Subdivision (1926) (Kitchen 1995:8).

These subdivisions were platted in a grid pattern and the neighborhood features a park in the southwest portion and a median along 7th Avenue North. The typical lots were narrow and long to accommodate the primary residence and a garage or garage apartment (Photo 1). The neighborhood design reflects the growing importance of the automobile, with the construction of alleys in the center of the blocks that accessed the rear garages or garage apartments that were designed to architecturally complement the primary residence (Photo 2). The streets are laid out in typical suburban format, with rear alleys and sidewalks in the front of the houses, which joined to the houses by a front walkway. The houses were built with their front porches facing the sidewalks. Kenwood contains 117 blocks or partial blocks and the St. Petersburg High School land takes up four additional blocks. Ten avenues traverse the district from east to west. These are numbered and named avenues: 1st through 9th Avenues North, Dartmouth Avenue North between 4th and 5th Avenues North, and Burlington Avenue, North between 2nd and 3rd Avenues North. The north-south corridors are numbered streets from 19th to 33rd Streets. Between every avenue is an alley. These alleys are paved with asphalt or are surfaced with shell, sand, and other materials.

Within Kenwood Historic District many of the historic landscape and streetscape elements remain. The majority of the avenues continue to be comprised of brick, and most of the streets are paved over with asphalt, which oftentimes occurred in the 1940s; however, some of the streets are still constructed of brick

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(Photo 3). Many of the sidewalks feature 12 to 16-inch hexagonal cast concrete pavers laid in sand in geometric patterns (Photo 4). Some sidewalks have been reconstructed with concrete in recent years. In addition, high granite curbs are still evident along most streets (Photo 5). The streets are lined with mature oak, jacaranda, and pine trees. A grass median surrounded by concrete curbs and featuring palm trees in located in the center of 7th Avenue North (Photo 6).

A notable element of the neighborhood is historic Seminole Park, which is located between 3rd Avenue North and Burlington Avenue North, and 30th Street North and 29th Street North (Photo 7). Charles R. Hall, one of the City's first developers and an initial developer of Kenwood, donated this park to the City of St. Petersburg. The rectangular park features sidewalks along the perimeter and four angled sidewalks leading to a circular sidewalk. In the center of the circular area is grass and a contemporary Craftsman style pavilion as the focus (Photo 8). The grassy park is also landscaped with various types of trees and has modern playground equipment.

Kenwood Historic District is made up primarily of single-family residences on single lot parcels. However, the district also features commercial and religious buildings, as well as the individually National Register listed St. Petersburg High School. Fewer than 170 buildings were constructed between 1913 and 1923; the rest were built between 1924 and 1953. The one- and two-story single-family houses are often sited on a slight ridge and retaining walls or low wood fences occasionally surround the properties. Typically the front elevations are set back approximately 12 to 15 feet from the sidewalks. Side set backs are approximately 10 feet between the buildings. These detached single-family houses reflect the area's primary function as a residential neighborhood. Nearly all of the single-family residences are owner occupied.

In addition to the single-family residences, there are numerous outbuildings, including garages, garage apartments, and detached apartment buildings (Photo 9). These ancillary buildings, which range in height from one- to two-stories, are often located behind the main house and architecturally compliment the primary building. These outbuildings were used for several purposes ranging from storing automobiles and various household equipment to housing mothers-in-laws or seasonal renters. In some cases, apartment buildings or garage apartments were constructed prior to the main house, so the owner could reside on the property while the main house was being built.

There are several primary apartment buildings scattered throughout the neighborhood. These two-story apartment buildings are commonly Mission or Frame Vernacular in style and rectangular or U-shaped in plan. They typically accommodate four to ten apartment units (Photo 10).

The district also contains five churches and 29 commercial buildings. The churches are primarily located on 1st Avenue North and 5th Avenue North, and range in style from the simple Frame and Masonry Vernacular to the more ornate Romanesque Revival. The commercial buildings are mostly on 1st Avenue

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North, 5th Avenue North, and south side of 9th Avenue North. These buildings are primarily one-story in height and Masonry Vernacular in style, with fixed storefront windows and occasionally shaped parapets.

There are a wide variety of architectural styles in Kenwood Historic District, reflecting popular early twentieth century styles from 1913 to 1953. Outbuildings are generally vernacular in style or reflect the architectural style of the associated residence. The majority of the houses within the district are Frame Vernacular or Craftsman Bungalow. Buildings of this type were constructed throughout the period of significance.

#### Frame Vernacular

In the Kenwood Historic District, the most prevalent style is the Frame Vernacular style with 1,100 buildings. A sizable number of these buildings are garages and garage apartments. Vernacular houses are those that illustrate a tradition of building, rather than the attributes of any formally acknowledged style. They were usually constructed without architectural plans by builders who had learned their craft through an apprenticeship to other builders who themselves were products of this apprenticeship system for successive generations. The majority of the vernacular houses in the historic district are simple one-story or two-story wood frame structures. Many of the Frame Vernacular houses display Craftsman Bungalow influences, such as exposed rafter tails, extended rooflines and main front porches.

A good example of the Frame Vernacular style is the residence at 2905 8th Avenue North (Photo 11). The one-story house has a cross-gabled roof and rests on a continuous chiseled concrete block foundation. The exterior walls are covered by weatherboard and an integral screened porch is found at the southeast corner of the building. Fenestration includes three-over-one and four-over-one wood double-hung sash windows. Another example of a Frame Vernacular residence is located at 736 31st Street North (Photo 12).

#### **Craftsman Bungalow**

There are more than 500 Craftsman Bungalow style buildings within the Kenwood Historic District. The Craftsman style was the most popular design for small residential buildings built throughout the country in the first three decades of the twentieth century. Influenced by the English Arts and Crafts Movement and Oriental and Indian architecture, the style was popularized by the work of two brothers, Charles S. and Henry M. Greene. The Greenes designed a number of large, elaborate prototypes of the style. Their innovative designs received a significant amount of publicity in national magazines. By the turn of the century, the design had been adapted to smaller houses, commonly referred to as bungalows. It was this scaled down version of the Craftsman style that became a ubiquitous feature of Florida's residential neighborhoods during the early twentieth century.

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A good example of this style is at 2761 Burlington Avenue North (Photo 13). This one-story Craftsman Bungalow with a cross-gabled roof features wide eaves, exposed rafter tails, decorative beams under the gables, and a full width porch. Brick piers that continue to ground level support the porch roof and there is also a closed brick railing. Two sets of French doors provide access to the residence from the porch. Another variation of the Craftsman Bungalow has a side-gabled porch with a front facing gabled portion on the end. Two examples of this variation are located at 2350 Burlington Avenue North and 2135 Burlington Avenue North (Photos 14 and 15). Other examples of Craftsman Bungalows in Kenwood Historic District are located at 2640 Burlington Avenue North, 2734 2nd Avenue North, and 2324 Burlington Avenue North (Photos 16-18). Some Craftsman Bungalows exhibit exotic influences from the Far East. The residence located at 2741 2nd Avenue North exhibits Japanese detailing (Photo 19).

#### **Minimal Traditional**

At least 150 buildings in the district were classified as Minimal Traditional style. The Minimal Traditional building form was introduced in the 1930s, at the height of the Great Depression, as a relatively low-cost building that was frequently employed in tract housing. Typically these residences possess at least one front facing gable. Architectural detailing is sparse and limited to vague references to the Colonial Revival or Monterey details.

A typical example of the style is located at 2230 2nd Avenue North (Photo 20). This one-story home has a low-pitched side-gabled roof with one front-facing gable. The exterior is covered in asbestos siding and the windows are one-over-one wood double-hung sash with decorative shutters. The front entry of the house features a shed roof cover with decorative metal supports. Two additional residences located at 725 28th Street North and 3210 7th Avenue North also exhibit the Minimal Traditional style (Photos 21 and 22).

#### **Masonry Vernacular**

At least 150 buildings in the district were identified as Masonry Vernacular. Buildings that reflect the Masonry Vernacular style are most often not designed by professionals and are modest in character. The style's guiding principle is the long tradition of simple masonry construction techniques used in Western architecture. The use of ready-mixed concrete revolutionized building techniques after 1920 (Rifkind 1980:293). Buildings constructed after this time typically used concrete blocks, which provided the same amount of strength as other traditional masonry units but were lighter and cheaper (McAlester 1993:38).

Within the project area, Masonry Vernacular residences reflect the architectural types of the Modern era of the late 1940s and early 1950s. An example of a Masonry Vernacular style home is located at 2920 8th Avenue North (Photo 23). This one-story house has a hipped roof and rests on a continuous concrete block foundation. The exterior walls of the building are covered in stucco and a shed roof covered porch on the south

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facade features decorative metal supports and railing. Fenestration includes metal casement windows and concrete sills. Decorative cast concrete medallions are applied to the exterior of this house. Residences located at 2220 7th Avenue North and 3011 6th Avenue North also feature hipped roofs and decorative metal porch supports (Photos 24 and 25).

#### **Tudor Revival**

In Kenwood Historic District, 65 Tudor Revival style buildings were found. The Tudor style first became popular in America during the first three decades of the 20th century. It was loosely based on a combination of references to the architecture of early sixteenth century Tudor England and a variety of Medieval English prototypes. Most Tudor residences in Florida date from the 1920s when the style reached its peak in popularity throughout the country. Some of the typical features of the Tudor style include steeply pitched roofs; decorative half-timbering and stucco siding; tall, narrow casement windows with multi-paned glazing; and massive exterior chimneys frequently located on the main elevation.

An example of this style is located at 2847 6th Avenue North (Photo 26). This one-and one-half-story home features a steeply pitched side-gabled roof and multiple front facing cross gables with decorative half-timbering in the gable ends. The entrance portal is located in the center bay, and accented with the steep gable roof shape that defines the Tudor Revival style. Decorative arched vents occur in the gable ends. Other good examples of the Tudor Revival style found in Kenwood Historic District are located at 3200 6th Avenue North and 2420 7th Avenue North (Photos 27 and 28).

#### Mediterranean Revival

Thirty-five Mediterranean Revival style buildings were found in Kenwood Historic District. Mediterranean Revival houses were popular in Florida during the 1920s and are closely associated with the Florida real estate boom that saw the development of resort cities like Miami Beach and Sarasota. Wealthy northerners who spent their winters in Florida often erected elaborate vacation houses that combined details of Spanish, Italian, and "Moorish" architecture. Many "Spanish" style houses were also constructed for homeowners of more modest means, and during the 1920s whole subdivisions were developed around the "tropical" theme of Mediterranean architecture. Typical details of the style include a combination of roof slopes, textured stucco walls, barrel tile roofs, cast stone or concrete ornament, and asymmetrical plan shapes.

The most notable example of the Mediterranean Revival style in the historic district is the house at 2900 7th Avenue North (Photo 29). The residence has an irregular plan and varies in height from one to two stories. The main entrance is found in a recessed porch. The window and door arrangement is irregular and features windows of varying sizes. The exterior is covered in stucco and the roof is clad in barrel tiles. A small balcony is featured on the north facade of the house. Another two-story Mediterranean Revival residence, located at 238

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25th Street North features arched wood double-hung sash windows (Photo 30). A good example of a one-story Mediterranean Revival residence, located at 3209 7th Avenue North, exhibits arched openings and a pyramidal-roofed tower (Photo 31).

#### **Colonial Revival**

More than thirty Colonial Revival style buildings are found within Kenwood Historic District. The term "Colonial Revival" refers to a rebirth of interest in the early English and Dutch colonial houses of the Atlantic Seaboard. The typical Colonial Revival house in Florida is an eclectic mixture of several colonial designs rather than a direst copy of a single plan. The style began to appear in the state in the late 1880s and continues to be built in modified forms today. Some the identifying characteristics of Colonial Revival architecture include gable, hip, or gambrel roof; an accentuated door, normally with a classical surround; simple entry porches supported by slender columns; a symmetrical facade; double hung-sash windows; and windows that are frequently set in pairs.

The house at 2536 3rd Avenue North is a good example of this style (Photo 32). This modest one-story house is distinguished by its balanced three-bay elevation. A pedimented entrance porch that features paired-wooden columns supporting the roof focuses the center bay. Windows include eight-over-one and four-over-four wood double-hung sash windows. The front door is made more prominent by the use of sidelights. A variation of the Colonial Revival style in Kenwood Historic District features an arched porch roof, supported by single or double columns. An example located at 2662 2nd Avenue North also exhibits semi-circular brick porch steps and the residence located at 2917 2nd Avenue North features two small eyebrow dormers on the roof slope (Photos 33 and 34).

#### Ranch

Seventeen Ranch style buildings were found within Kenwood Historic District. The Ranch style originated in California during the early 1930s and ultimately became the dominant style for suburban residences during the 1940s and 1950s. Its low rectangular form, low-pitched roofs, and linear plan characterize the Ranch style. Houses were sited so that they were parallel to the street, and garages were integral to the plan, usually on the main elevation. A later example of this style is located at 631 29th Street North (Photo 35). This one-story residence extends across a large corner lot and features an asymmetrical facade with a low-pitched hip roof. The exterior of this house is brick and it rests on a concrete slab foundation. A built-in one-car garage is located on the principal elevation. Another feature of the Ranch style, exhibited in residences located at 2470 7th Avenue North and 2430 8th Avenue North, is a large picture window comprised of fixed, single, or multi-lights commonly flanked by casement windows (Photos 36 and 37).

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#### **Prairie**

Within Kenwood Historic District, ten Prairie style buildings were found. The Prairie style originated in Chicago at the turn of the 20th century with a group of architects heavily influenced by the prototypical designs of Frank Lloyd Wright in the suburbs of Oak Park and River Forest, Illinois. While the style had its genesis in the Midwest, pattern books quickly spread the style throughout the country. Prairie style houses appear in Florida between approximately 1915 through 1929. Low-pitched, hipped roofs with widely overhanging eaves, bands of narrow casement windows, and simple rectangular ground plans combine to create the characteristic horizontality of the style.

The house at 2901 1st Avenue North is a good example of the Prairie style (Photo 38). This two-story house, which has been converted to a commercial use, has a smooth stucco exterior and a low-pitched hip roof with widely overhanging eaves. The asymmetrical front facade of the house features a hipped roof porch with doubled wood porch supports and a closed railing. Fenestration includes three-over-one wood double-hung sash windows with wood window surrounds. Two additional examples of the Prairie style are located at 2142 Burlington Avenue North and 2159 4th Avenue North (Photos 39 and 40).

#### American Foursquare

Eight American Foursquare style buildings were found within Kenwood Historic District. The predominant characteristic of this style is the regularity of plan and elevation. Generally residences are two-and-a-half stories in height with each elevation the same height and width, creating a pronounced square shape. Frequently the houses feature Prairie-type eaves overhangs and single-story front porches.

The residence at 2130 2nd Avenue North is an excellent example of this style (Photo 41). This two-story American Foursquare has a hipped roof, with wide overhanging eaves, a symmetrical facade, and full width front porch. Brick piers support the hipped roof porch and the railing is closed brick. Another excellent example of this style, located at 2936 4th Avenue North, exhibits a hip-roofed, centrally located porch supported by square brick columns (Photo 42). A simple version of the American-Foursquare is located at 2324 7th Avenue North (Photo 43).

#### Mission

Within Kenwood Historic District, seven buildings represent the Mission style architecture. The Spanish Mission style gained widespread popularity in Florida during the decade before the collapse of the Florida Land Boom in 1926. It was adapted for a variety of building types ranging from large tourist hotels to two room residences. Identifying features of the style include flat sometimes hipped roofs, a curvilinear parapet

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or dormer either on the main or porch roof; barrel tile roofing; stuccoed facades; flat entrance porches, commonly with arched openings; casement and double hung-sash windows, and ceramic tile decorations.

Less than one-half of one percent of the residences in the district can be considered Mission in style. These are mainly one-story homes with deep front porches. The house at 2360 2nd Avenue North is a good example of a Mission house (Photo 44). This modest one-story residence is designed with a three-bay elevation featuring an entrance porch in the center bay. Both the entrance porch and the walls of the main residence possess the curved parapet typically associated with the Mission style. The entry porch is pierced on three sides by round arches. The smooth stucco walls of the home are enlivened by the addition of cast concrete ornamental sills and band coursing around the chimney. Another good example of a Mission style residence, located at 2047 2nd Avenue North, features an arched door surround with a stylized keystone (Photo 45).

#### **Dutch Colonial Revival**

Seven buildings within Kenwood Historic District were found to represent the Dutch Colonial Revival style. Originally the Dutch Colonial design was seen principally during the 18th and 19th century in the Northeast. Its predominant characteristics included side-gabled or side-gambrel roofs with no roof overhang. Colonists brought the design to the New World from the Netherlands. The tradition was revived in America in the 1920s as historicism became popular.

There are seven examples of Dutch Colonial Revival style homes in the neighborhood. The house at 2901 7th Avenue North is a good example of this style (Photo 46). This two-story house features a gambrel roof that contains a full second story that features a continuous shed dormer pierced by three pairs of windows. A pedimented portico supported by slender wood columns emphasizes the main entrance. A one-story enclosed side wing with a hipped roof is located on the west elevation of the house. The residence located at 2134 Burlington Avenue North exhibits a gambrel roof, a large dormer and brick detailing (Photo 47).

#### Romanesque Revival

Only one building within Kenwood Historic District was found that represented the Romanesque Revival style. Romanesque Revival buildings in the middle decades of the 19th century were sometimes used for institutional and commercial buildings. Buildings are masonry with at least some rough-faced stonework. Wide, rounded arches are a key feature of the style (McAlester 1984:301-302).

Albright Methodist Church, located at 2750 5th Avenue North, is a principal example of the style. The building is constructed of brick with stone accents. The plan arrangement is asymmetrical with the main entrance located in a three-story tower bay at the west end of the church. The main entrance is a direct reference to the 12th century ecclesiastical architecture that employed an archivolt, the continuous architrave

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molding on the face of the arch. The detail of the rose window in the third story of the tower features a coarse tracery, again indicative of the Early Romanesque European examples. The long axis of the building containing the sanctuary is one and one-half stories in height, and is distinguished in elevation by the use of intermittent pier buttresses that separate each bay, which is fenestrated with a single, round-arch stained glass window.

#### **ALTERATIONS**

Exterior alterations to principal structures in Kenwood Historic District typically involve the enclosure of front porch areas with windows or louvers and the covering of original wood siding with aluminum, asbestos, or vinyl siding. Other common alterations include the replacement of original windows with aluminum jalousie or metal frame awning windows. Some buildings display modified window opening configurations. Changes to outbuildings range from window replacement to the enclosing of garage door openings.

#### CONTRIBUTING AND NONCONTRIBUTING CLASSIFICATIONS

Contributing buildings include those that have achieved significance within the last fifty years and that contribute to the overall sense of Kenwood Historic District's character, either because they are united historically or aesthetically by plan or physical development. Contributing buildings must also possess sufficient integrity, meaning that the character-defining features that create their identity are substantially intact.

Noncontributing properties are those that are constructed after 1953, and/or those properties that have been substantially altered so that their original qualities can no longer be discerned. Some examples of alterations or a combination of alterations that may destroy the original character-defining features include: the in-filling of original doors and windows or alteration of original openings; and additions that obscure or change original scale, materials, and features. An example of noncontributing building, which exhibits substantial alterations, is located at 2454 9th Avenue North (Photos 48).

Where alterations are considered easily reversible, the property was classified as "contributing". Some examples include: the application of siding or veneers, the replacement of windows with a different type, and the enclosure of porches.

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#### **SUMMARY PARAGRAPH**

Kenwood Historic District is significant at a local level under criteria A and C in the areas of Community Planning and Development and Architecture. Representative of the early residential development of the City of St. Petersburg during the first half of the twentieth century, Kenwood Historic District is associated with the broad patterns of the community's history. The neighborhood is one of the first suburban residential areas to be developed outside of the central business area of the City. Comprised of a distinctive and sizable collection of intact early twentieth century suburban architecture, Kenwood Historic District is architecturally significant. A wide variety of residential architectural styles from c. 1913 to 1953 are represented in the historic district. The district also retains many of its original design features, including brick streets and alleys, hexagonal block sidewalks, and granite curbing as well as its original layout and grid pattern with alleys that parallel the avenues. Based on this concentration of historic buildings and the retention of the historic character, Kenwood Historic District reflects the architectural influences of the decades before, during, and after the Florida Land Boom era.

#### HISTORIC CONTEXT

For more than two decades following the conclusion of the Civil War, the southern portion of Florida remained a wilderness and predominantly unsettled.1 During this period, the State of Florida was faced with a financial crisis involving the title to public lands. The trustees of the State's Internal Improvement Trust Fund had pledged public lands to underwrite the issuing of railroad bonds. This plan to bring the railroads to Florida left the State on the verge of bankruptcy and the public lands heavily mortgaged. This mortgage debt had to be cleared before the State could sell the land. Hamilton Disston (1844-1896), a wealthy Philadelphian, offered to purchase 4,000,000 acres of land in central and south Florida for twenty-five cents an acre, which in turn alleviated the State's debt and allowed for new railroad construction.

With the possibility of new settlement and transportation improvements, many large landowners transferred their interests from agriculture to speculative development. Disston, who owned thousands of acres on the Pinellas peninsula and was—for a brief time—among the largest private landowners in the United States, financed Peter Demens (1860-1919), a Russian émigré speculator, under the assumption he would facilitate his development goals by extending the railway to Disston City (now Gulfport). Demens built the narrow gauge railroad to Pinellas County, but slighted Disston by placing its terminus well northeast of Disston City on 1,600 acres of land owned by John C. Williams (1816-1892), a Detroit real estate developer. In return, Williams gave Demens 250 acres of prime waterfront land in the area platted as the town of St. Petersburg in 1888. Shortly

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after naming the new town after his birthplace, Demens went bankrupt and left Florida (Grismer, 217-220; Arsenault, 52-60). In 1888 there were just 30 residents in the newly-platted town; however, by 1892, the year St. Petersburg was incorporated as a city, the population had grown to over 300 residents, a 300 percent increase in just four years.

Henry Bradley Plant, who incorporated the short line into this rapidly expanding interstate rail system, subsequently purchased the Orange Belt Railroad in 1895 and improved its trackage and passenger system. In spite of this, Plant eliminated the commercial port so it would not compete with other nearby facilities in Port Tampa. The existence of a reliable rail transportation system provided the agricultural community with access to northern markets; however, the Plant railroad primarily promoted the foundation of St. Petersburg's new economy: tourism. Consequently, as the local economy grew so did the residents, from 273 persons in 1890 to 1,575 in 1900 (Grismer, 50).

In 1895, the year before his suicide, Hamilton Disston transferred title to his large property holdings in Pinellas to his brother Jacob who spent the rest of his life trying to develop the land with a group of fellow Philadelphia investors that included Frank A. Davis (1850-1917), George Gandy (1851-1937), and Charles R. Hall (1869-1939). They created an elaborate maze of interlocking companies to finance and promote ambitious real estate development schemes. By 1924 this group had platted thousands of acres of land surrounding downtown St. Petersburg into residential communities linked to the business district through a large streetcar system. These developments included the present-day towns of Gulfport, Pinellas Park, and Pasadena as well as the Jungle, West Central, Davista, and Pinellas Point subdivisions of St. Petersburg (Grismer, 67-79). The scale, financing methods, and marketing hype of this scheme would serve as an example for other real estate developers around the state during the Florida Land Boom of 1921-1927, while the sprawling decentralized pattern of suburban development would permanently define the character of St. Petersburg and southern Pinellas County.

In the early years of the twentieth century, improvements were undertaken in the expanding community of St. Petersburg. In 1904, a streetcar line was opened, streets were paved, and more developers purchased land for transfer. By 1910, the city's population exceeded four thousand. By the mid-1910s, a second railroad arrived and the first major road to the peninsula was completed. Charles M. Roser and C. Perry Snell were among the developers who arrived in St. Petersburg, competing for the business of the hundreds of new residents and tourists arriving daily. Snell, who envisioned a high-end residential enclave along the Tampa Bay and owned almost all of the land north of 5th Avenue North and east of 4th Street, and his partner J.C. Hamlett began selling lots in the North Shore subdivision in 1911.

That same year the City expanded its southern boundary to 17th Avenue South, and by 1914 included the land north to 22nd Avenue and west to Boca Ciega Bay within its corporate limits. Central Avenue the major east-west corridor was extended to the Bay and trolley lines were installed down the center. Following

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Snell's example, Charles Roser purchased 30 acres and created a neighborhood of elegant homes facing Booker Creek. (The Roser Park Historic District was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 1998).

To draw attention to this thinly populated area of Florida, developers, particularly Disston and his partners, had to create a market for their Pinellas real estate, and boosterism would take hold of the city's founding fathers, aided early on by the praise issued at the 1885 annual convention of the American Medical Association by Dr. W.C. Van Bibber. Bibber pronounced Point Pinellas as the perfect location for a "Health City," pointing out that "no marsh surrounds its shores or rests upon its surface; the sweep of its beach is broad and graceful...Its average winter temperature is 72 degrees; that its climate is peculiar, its natural products show; that its air is healthy, the ruddy appearance of its few inhabitants attest" (Arsenault, 53).

Frank Davis, president of the F. A. Davis Publishing Company of Philadelphia, the country's largest publisher of medical books and journals, would pick up on this theme as he vigorously promoted the region. He was the architect of the advertising campaign that would transform St. Petersburg into a major winter tourist resort. From 1897 to 1917 doctors throughout the country read propaganda about "the Sunshine City" in their journals, and prescribed a winter in St. Petersburg to their patients (Grismer, 67-68). The convalescing visitors to the booming resort were lured into buying property by the droves of real estate agents who worked the hotel lobbies of downtown St. Petersburg.

Local newspaper editors, including William Straub and Lew Brown, would continue the drumbeat by filling the pages of the St. Petersburg Times and the St. Petersburg Evening Independent with tourist news and stories depicting the Sunshine City as America's premiere vacation land. One noteworthy stunt was Bill Carpenter's four-month odyssey to the west coast in 1916 to lure visitors. Nicknamed the "Alligator Man," Carpenter set off with a six-foot alligator named "Trouble" and wandered the country with a pile of promotional brochures. Carpenter went on to become a real estate promoter in the city until his death in 1973 (Arsenault, 146).

The first string of tourist Pullmans from New York rolled into St. Petersburg in 1909. In 1913, the City welcomed its first tourist train from the Midwest -- an Atlantic Coast Line special carrying two hundred sun worshipers from Ohio and Indiana (Arsenault, 144). With this first influx, the city began consciously promoting itself as a tourist destination. Recognizing the importance of tourism to the city, Mayor Al Lang played a leading role in the creation of the Festival of States, an annual city festival designed to increase the flow of winter visitors. Grafted on to the city's traditional Washington birthday and Mid-Winter Fair Celebrations, the Festival of States made its first appearance in March 1917. Lang's tourist-oriented administration represented a turning point in the city's economic and political history. From then onward the public effort to encourage tourism would be formal and uninterrupted.

Instrumental in the early development of tourism in St. Petersburg were the tourist societies, which

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historian Grimser noted, "undoubtedly aided materially in making St. Petersburg one of the most famous resort cities in the world" (Grismer, 194). The societies provided an ideal means for tourists to mingle together and become acquainted. Meetings were held by all of the societies at regular intervals and "interesting programs given by skilled entertainers." In addition to the indoor meetings, each society had one or more outdoor events during the season - a clambake, a picnic or an excursion on Tampa Bay. Tourists from Illinois formed the first society in 1902, followed by Michigan (1907), Wisconsin (1908), New York/New Jersey (1909), Pennsylvania (1913), Canada (1913), Ohio (1914), Indiana (1914), Iowa (1917), Southland (1919) and Maine (1920) (Grismer, 196). By 1924, practically every section of the country was represented by a society in St. Petersburg and the total membership exceeded twelve thousand people.

The City also had many attractions designed to lure visitors, particularly around the Mirror Lake section. Constructed in the mid-1920s, the Coliseum located at 535 4th Avenue North soon became a major southern destination for performers of the swing era during the 1920s and 1930s. Big name entertainers made the Coliseum a regular stop on the travel circuit, including Louis Armstrong, Count Bassie, Les Brown, Cab Calloway, Jimmy Dorsey, Duke Ellington, Dizzy Gillespie, Benny Goodman, Buddy Holly, Sammy Kaye, Kay Kyser, Ted Lewis, Guy Lombardo, Glenn Miller, Will Rodgers, Artie Shaw, and Rudy Vallee. Also located near Mirror Lake, the Lawn Bowling Club began hosting national and regional lawn bowling championships in the 1920s to draw winter visitors. The membership of the club grew steadily until it reached a peak of 483 in 1952-53. Finally, the Mirror Lake Shuffleboard Courts also provided recreational opportunities for the winter visitor beginning in 1923.

During the period between 1911 and 1914 more than 20,000 residential lots had been created. In 1914 the City Council voted to use brick for the paving material on over 75 miles of roadway, and adopted an overall street system that featured wide roadways with boulevards between them. Trees were planted, streetlights were installed, and water and sewerage was provided to enhance the desirability of the newly platted subdivisions. Sanborn Fire Insurance maps reveal that while the subdivisions were platted, there were only a scattering of homes completed before an economic downturn occurred, which coincided with the June 1914 assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand in Sarajevo that set in motion the events leading to World War I.

The city's massive self-promotion campaign became more sophisticated after World War I. In 1918 St. Petersburg became the first city in the country to hire a public relations director, John Lodwick. His barrage of creative news releases and manipulation of the print media obtained millions of dollars in free advertising for the city during the 1920s (Arsenault, 186).

The Davis and Lodwick media hype paid off handsomely. The city grew from 1,575 in 1900 to 14,237 in 1920; by 1924 an estimated twenty-six thousand people lived in St. Petersburg while hotel rooms (excluding boarding houses and apartments) increased from 675 in 1905 to 7000 in 1925 after the construction of ten major new hotels in St. Petersburg and its environs (Grismer (a), 202). St. Petersburg was caught up in the speculation

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of the Florida Land Boom that began in 1920 and peaked in 1925 when city building permits for the year totaled \$24 million in construction and local banks held \$46 million in deposits (Arsenault, 254). The real estate boom crashed between 1926 and 1927 in St. Petersburg and construction ceased, but the tourist trade continued unabated until the 1930 season. By then, the city's population had grown to 40,425 in 1930 (Arsenault, 253).

Even though the land boom had collapsed, St. Petersburg's economy survived, thanks largely to its reputation as a popular winter resort. By 1930, there were over one-hundred and forty hotels in St. Petersburg, but the Great Depression would take its toll as no other major hotels would be built in lower Pinellas from the peak of the boom era until Harry Playford built The Tides at Redington Beach in 1939 (Fuller, 159). The permanent population also grew, reaching 60,8122 in 1940, filling the vacant parcels created during the boom era (Arsenault, 272).

The residential subdivisions of St. Petersburg developed rapidly during the Florida Land Boom of the 1920s, yielding a population increase of 36,000 people in five years. Major destination hotels in St. Petersburg, such as the Vinoy and the Soreno, were designed in a Mediterranean Revival style and constructed on the waterfront. These hotels accommodated seasonal visitors and prospective land buyers. During this period, \$12 million dollars were spent on road paving. The Municipal Pier opened in 1924, and the Gandy Bridge connecting Tampa to St. Petersburg was completed in 1925. However, by the mid-1920s, the development and construction frenzy of the Land Boom began to show a dramatic decline.

Several factors contributed to the failure of Florida's real estate market. In the spring of 1925, many investors began to cancel all Florida real estate transactions as they became panicked by news of bogus Florida real estate ventures. The bust was brought on by excessive speculation that drove up the price of land and articles in the northern newspapers warning buyers of the Florida "land shark." As building activity began to slow, other unfortunate events affected the area. In 1926 and 1928, devastating hurricanes swept through South Florida destroying thousands of buildings and completely halting further development plans in the area. Also, a Mediterranean fruit fly infestation threatened Florida's profitable citrus industry. These incidents proved to be disastrous for Florida, which entered an economic depression several years before the rest of the country.

With the onset of the Great Depression in 1929, the local economy and construction industry further declined. Building halted, mortgage financing was nonexistent, and builders were out of work. Banks throughout the area failed during this era, including the Central and National Bank and Trust Company on Central Avenue, which was the victim of a run by the majority of its depositors. Fortunately, the beautiful weather and natural resources still drew tourists into the area during the 1930s. Additionally, President Roosevelt's programs included housing industry revitalization measures such as insured bank deposits, the refinancing of home mortgages, and financed public construction projects. These new federal regulations and other programs such as the WPA helped boost building activity once again.

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War restrictions imposed after Pearl Harbor destroyed tourism, but the local economy was saved from complete disaster for a period of some eighteen months, beginning in mid-1942, when empty hotels such as the Vinoy, Soreno, Princess Martha and practically every available room in the city were converted into military barracks. Only the Suwannee Hotel was available for non-military visitors, set aside by common consent for the thin stream of commercial people who still came to town (Fuller, 190). Between 1942 and 1943 more than 100,000 military personnel passed through St. Petersburg (Arsenault, 299). During and after World War II, infill housing was prevalent in the neighborhoods that had been platted during the Land Boom of the 1920s. The widespread demand for housing intensified and the city witnessed another building boom. The post-war 1940s saw a tremendous population boom in St. Petersburg with many of the servicemen who trained here returning to work in the construction and service industries. Returning veterans were offered low-interest, long-term mortgages, and new technology and building materials allowed for buildings to be constructed quickly and cheaply. By 1950, the population had reached 96,836; twenty years later it would exceed 216,000, mainly comprised of retirees who built cottages in the vast subdivisions platted in the 1920s boom (Arsenault, 312).

Although many of St. Petersburg's neighborhoods were virtually built-out, houses and low-rise apartments buildings were constructed on the various vacant lots at this time. The increase in growth continued on from the 1950s through the 1970s; however, much of this expansion occurred outside of the City's central core. During this time, single-family homes, mobile homes, and condominiums were erected and the historic downtown area would begin to lose its tourists to the new motels along the nearby gulf beaches and retail shops moved to suburban shopping malls.

Within the last few years, residents living within St. Petersburg's older neighborhoods have made concerted efforts to revitalize the City's historic areas. This NRHP nomination reflects the citizens' desires to recognize and preserve their architectural and historic resources.

#### COMMUNITY PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

The property that presently makes up Kenwood Historic District remained mostly uninhabited until the turn-of-the-century. The early part of the twentieth century saw an enormous amount of real estate activity in St. Petersburg, and individuals were arriving from the North with the purpose of getting involved in the real estate boom of the 1920s. An intensive period of development was touched off when H. Walter Fuller extended Central Avenue westward from Ninth Street. He and three other developers, Noel A. Mitchell and Charles A. Hall began competitively opening new subdivisions along West Central Avenue. Mitchell, opened Mitchell's Court House subdivision, setting aside a whole block for a proposed courthouse. Fuller, who was instrumental in the development of Bradenton and then became involved in St. Petersburg's real estate during the first two decades of the twentieth century, platted Fuller's, John Pass, and St. Petersburg Investment Company subdivisions. Hall, in turn, opened four subdivisions along Central Avenue (Olausen 1994:6). Charles R. Hall was a millinery and window shade salesman, who came to St. Petersburg from Philadelphia around 1910 and

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began his local real estate activities in 1912 with the planning and platting of two neighborhoods in the west-central part of the city, Hall's Central Avenue #1 and Hall's Central Avenue #2 subdivisions. Later he developed Lakewood Estates, south of Lake Maggiore.

Hall's Central Avenue #1 and #2 subdivisions are located within Kenwood Historic District, together forming the largest land parcel within the boundaries, and including Seminole Park, the only park within the survey area. The plats were first submitted on March 15, 1912 for the area between 25th and 31st Streets North, 1st Avenue South and 7th Avenue North (now 5th Avenue North). Hall's subdivisions were only part of what would later become Kenwood Historic District. Throughout the early 1920s, the City of St. Petersburg approved plats for the subdivisions that would eventually create Kenwood Historic District. By the mid-1920s, the entire area of Kenwood Historic District was platted. The 1923 Sanborn Insurance Maps show approximately 140 houses in the area from 1st to 7th Avenues North (1st to 5th today), and 19th to 31st Streets North.

Boom-time subdivisions such as Kenwood Historic District, as well as the large hotels including the Vinoy, greatly affected the growth and development of St. Petersburg in the 1920s. The physical size of the City expanded relative to increase in population. However, by late-1925, the collapse of the Land Boom was eminent. During 1925, with the decline of the Florida real estate market on the horizon, construction throughout the City significantly decreased, and this included development within Kenwood Historic District. Most of the houses had been built prior to the Bust, so the neighborhood's development was not adversely affected by the hard times. However, after almost a decade of non-stop building activity, construction in Kenwood Historic District began to taper off.

In 1926, the construction of St. Petersburg High School, required a large parcel of land between 5th and 9th Avenues North and 25th and 26th Streets, this had a major effect on the northern part of Kenwood Historic District. In 1928, the City of St. Petersburg adopted a series of avenue name changes, and 3rd Avenue North became Burlington Avenue North, 6th Avenue North became Dartmouth Avenue North, 7th Avenue North became 5th Avenue North, and 8th Avenue North became 7th Avenue North. In recent history, construction of Interstate 275 has also had a significant impact, and now defines Kenwood Historic District's eastern boundary.

With the stock market crash of 1929 and the following Great Depression years, construction halted, mortgage financing was nonexistent, and builders were out of work. In the early 1930s, President Roosevelt adopted measures to revitalize the housing industry, among them insuring bank deposits and refinancing home mortgages, and new technology allowed houses to be built quickly and cheaply. Although the neighborhood was mainly built-out, some houses and apartments were constructed during the 1940s. In the years following the 1940s, St. Petersburg's development began to move west, and very few houses were built within the city's older neighborhoods such as Kenwood Historic District. Upon the conclusion of World War II, a moderate amount of infill housing was built within the City's older neighborhoods, such as Kenwood Historic District.

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A look at the demographics of the neighborhood throughout its history illumines the character of the inhabitants of the historic district. A random sampling of occupations in City Directories from 1920, 1925, 1927, 1930, 1933, 1938, 1940,1944, and 1947 reveals both the growth of the neighborhood, as well as the socio-economic level of its homeowners. During the 1920s, occupations such as contractor, painter, and salesman indicate the solid middle-class nature of the district. Throughout the 1930s, 1940s and 1950s, the bedrock of the neighborhood is composed of residents with professions such as bookkeepers, policemen, carpenters, and salesmen.

The rapid growth and development of Kenwood Historic District in many ways mirrored the progress of Florida during the Land Boom era. The Land Boom years were integral to the formation of the state as well as St. Petersburg. Kenwood Historic District's development and planning were instrumental to the early expansion of the City beyond the downtown core. The district also represents the fast growing speculative neighborhoods of the early 1920s. One of the earliest neighborhoods in the City, Kenwood Historic District remains a significant link to the developmental history of St. Petersburg.

#### ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE

Kenwood Historic District maintains architectural significance based on its various examples of architecture dating from c. 1913 through 1953. The district possesses a high concentration of Frame Vernacular and Craftsman Bungalows as well as notable buildings constructed in a number of architectural styles including: Minimal Traditional, Masonry Vernacular, Tudor Revival, Mediterranean Revival, Colonial Revival, Ranch, Prairie, American Foursquare, Dutch Colonial Revival, Mission, and Romanesque Revival.

The significance of the composition of the neighborhood is particularly important, as the quality of the architectural design is not a result of income, but rather the result of high-minded planning ideals and inherently good design. Kenwood Historic District illustrates the democracy of design that has been maintained for more than sixty years.

Kenwood Historic District also features numerous intact garages and garage-apartments designed to compliment the main buildings. The majority of the buildings in the district maintain good to excellent integrity. Some buildings were constructed prior to 1920 as well as in the 1930s, 1940s, and early 1950s, but the bulk of the buildings were constructed during the Land Boom years of the 1920s. Because of its overall architectural and contextual cohesiveness and the retention of historic features such as the hexagonal sidewalk pavers, granite curbstones, brick streets, Seminole Park, and landscaping, Kenwood Historic District is a distinguishable neighborhood within the City of St. Petersburg.

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#### ARCHITECTURAL STYLES

#### Frame Vernacular

The Frame Vernacular is a style frequently found within Kenwood Historic District. These buildings were generally designed and constructed by local craftsmen and builders from readily available materials. The houses are usually rectangular in plan for economical construction. Most of the buildings have horizontal clapboard siding. Many of the Frame Vernacular features are a result of environmental concerns. The overhanging roof eaves provide shade for the sides of the house and dormers supply additional air circulation. Other common features are the hipped or gabled roofs; roof overhangs with exposed rafter tails, wooden shingles, and slat porch balusters. In 1920, the Craftsman Bungalow significantly influenced the vernacular house design. As a result, post-1920 Frame Vernacular houses feature some Craftsman elements such as knee braces and crossover gabled roofs.

#### **Craftsman Bungalow**

Another predominant house style within Kenwood Historic District is Craftsman Bungalow. Inspired by construction techniques and the English Arts and Crafts movement, Craftsman architecture was popularized in America primarily by the work of Greene and Greene, brothers and architects from California. During the first three decades of the twentieth century, Craftsman bungalows became the favored house type throughout the country. Craftsman houses are typically one- or two-stories high and feature low-pitched, gabled roofs with wide eaves and exposed roof rafters. Decorative beams or knee braces are commonly added under the gables and tapered square columns support the porches. Exterior materials can vary between clapboard, shingles, and stucco. Windows often have a three-over-one light configuration, but can also exhibit various multi-light windowpane configurations.

#### **Minimal Traditional**

The Minimal Traditional style was a popular house style from the 1930s through the 1950s. In the 1930s, during the Great Depression, Minimal Traditional houses appeared throughout the country as a subtle response to the economic hardships of the era and the ornate styles of the 1920s. Minimal Traditional buildings reflect a combination of influences from earlier traditional styles such as Tudor or Colonial Revival. Common attributes of the style are low or moderate roof pitches, very little roof overhang, and front-facing gables. Typically, these one-story houses also have prominent exterior chimneys, wood double-hung sash windows, vents or decorative wood in the gable ends, and Colonial Revival influences such as door surrounds and shutters.

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#### Masonry Vernacular

A number of single-family residences and apartment buildings within the district are considered Masonry Vernacular. Similar to the Frame Vernacular houses in the district, Masonry Vernacular houses were inexpensive to construct and simple in design. In most cases, the houses constructed in this style date from the 1920s through the 1950s. They are constructed of hollow tile or concrete block, covered with stucco, and then painted. The houses are generally rectangular in plan, one to two stories in height, and exhibit little or no ornamentation. Like the Frame Vernacular residences in the district, the Masonry Vernacular houses in the neighborhood often have Craftsman or Prairie style elements. Masonry Vernacular buildings from the 1930s, 1940s, and 1950s show influences of the International and Modern styles such as bands scored in the stucco.

#### **Tudor Revival**

Tudor Revival buildings were loosely based on early-sixteenth century Tudor and various medieval English houses ranging from thatch-roofed cottages to grand manors. Built primarily in the 1920s, these houses feature a combination of elements from various English precedents such as steeply pitched roofs, front-facing gables, overlapping gables, half-timbering, multiple exterior materials, casement windows, and prominent chimneys.

#### Mediterranean Revival

The Mediterranean Revival style is the architectural style most intimately linked with the 1920s Florida Land Boom. The style in Florida has its origin in early twentieth century architects desire to create a building style appropriate to the history of the Sun Belt areas of the United States. The style was intended to embody the history and romance of the State's Spanish heritage, and draw new residents and winter tourists to the picturesque resort area. Sometimes referred to under various subheadings including Spanish Colonial Revival, the style was influenced by building traditions in Spain and other countries along the Mediterranean Sea, including Italy and Northern Africa. The style was often applied to domestic buildings in upper- or middle-class developments of the 1920s.

The Mediterranean Revival homes and apartment buildings in the neighborhood are characterized by an eclectic mix of details such as cast stone or concrete columns and applied decorative elements, as well as stuccoed wall surfaces, and low-pitched clay barrel tile roofs. Doors and windows are often arched and balconies are common. Frequently the plan included a courtyard framed by the wings of the residence.

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#### Colonial Revival

The Colonial Revival style embodies the massing and details of the early English and Dutch houses built in American during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. Although based primarily on the eighteenth century classical Georgian and Adam styles, the Colonial Revival houses found in the district are an eclectic mixture of several periods without reference to a particular period or formal style. These houses were popular in the United States in the early twentieth century from the 1910s through the 1930s, with resurgence during the post-World War II years. Typical features include side-gabled roofs, symmetrical plans, front doors with pediments, transoms, fanlights, and sidelights, and small entrance porches with classically inspired columns.

#### Ranch

The Ranch style originated in California during the mid-1930s and continued to be constructed through the mid-1970s. The popularity of this style is attributed to the increased dependence on automobiles after World War II and the cheaper land prices of the post-war era. The faint influences of Spanish Colonial, Prairie, and Craftsman architecture can be seen in Ranch style buildings. The one-story buildings generally have an asymmetrical front elevation and a horizontal emphasis. They have low-pitched roofs that are typically hipped, but sometimes gabled. Ranch houses usually have few extraneous decorative features.

#### Prairie

The Prairie style was developed in Chicago and derived its name from the prairies of the Midwest. This architectural style is exemplified through a horizontal emphasis and wide projecting eaves. Developed primarily by architect Frank Lloyd Wright, who advocated a style that was integrated with the landscape and in harmony with its setting. Massive square piers that serve as porch supports, bands of windows, flat or low-pitched hipped roofs, and wide eaves characterize this style. Simplicity is a characteristic of these buildings, which is often demonstrated through an emphasis on massing versus decorative details. In this neighborhood, some examples of the style have paired brackets underneath the roof eaves that are not commonly associated with the Prairie style.

#### American Foursquare

One of the less prevalent house types within Kenwood Historic District is the American Foursquare. Between circa- 1900 and 1930, the Foursquare was a common house type in the United States and was found throughout the new post-Victorian era suburbs. A descendant of the eighteenth century Georgian style house, the Foursquare was the middle class interpretation of the earlier house form. Because these houses feature little extraneous ornamentation and were well suited to the 20th century building techniques and materials, many new middle class homeowners were drawn to the Foursquare. The house's cubical shape took advantage of building

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on small lots. This house type is typically two stories in height, with hipped or pyramidal roofs, pronounced eaves, and little exterior decoration. The foursquare entrance is commonly off-center, and if the house does have any decorative elements, they typically consist of a beltcourse or Prairie and Craftsman features.

#### **Mission**

The Mission style originated in California during the 1880s and 1890s in response to its Spanish heritage and the romantic Franciscan mission churches found along the State's coastline. In keeping with Florida's Spanish roots, the Mission style also became popular in the state during the Land Boom years. Generally, Mission houses are simple in design and were inexpensive to build. The district features one and two-story residences and apartment buildings constructed in the Mission style, which often display flat roofs behind a shaped parapet and/or barrel tile coping, stucco wall surfaces, and arched openings. Since the defining characteristic of the Mission style is simplicity, texture and substance are the most important features of this style.

#### **Dutch Colonial Revival**

The term "Colonial Revival" refers to a rebirth of interest in the early English and Dutch colonial houses of the Atlantic Seaboard. The Dutch Colonial style acquired popularity between 1900 and World War II. In Kenwood Historic District the style is apparent in a small number of houses. Common characteristics of this style are symmetrical facades, doorways ornamented with columns, sidelights, transoms and gambrel roofs.
