### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

#### SUMMARY

Built in 1886 in the town once known as Argenta by German immigrants, the Barth-Hempfling House is the only surviving residence on Main Street in what is now known as North Little Rock. A fine example of Victorian vernacular architecture, the structure features a porch with Queen Anne style jig-sawn brackets and decorative triangular trim all supported by Queen Anne-type turned spindles. Architecturally simple, yet special in its rarity, the Barth-Hempfling House represents an important era of development in the history of North Little Rock.

### ELABORATION

The Barth-Hempfling House is situated among commercial buildings, yet maintains a fairly spacious lot filled with mature shrubbery and large handsome trees. The one-story, central hall, side-gabled structure with an ell is clad in wood lapped siding and the roof, once covered in traditional wood shingles, is now sheathed with octagonally-shaped composition shingles. The structure rests on a brick foundation. The facade is dominated by a small but richly decorated front porch supported by four Queen Anne-inspired turned posts at the front with two engaged posts attaching the porch to the structure. Simple square railing frames the bottom while jig-sawn brackets embellish the posts at the top and decorative triangular trim spans the posts between brackets.

Simple cap moldings sit atop windows, each as two-over-two pane, double-hung sash window except for the side windows which are six-over-six pane. Enhanced by a glazed transom, the door is half glass with three wooden panels below.

In plan, the structure has a central hall flanked by two rooms on each side. Eleven foot ceilings grace the hall and four original rooms. Doors have four panels and possess prominent casing with corner rosettes. In 1915, the structure was modernized by construction of an ell addition on the northwest side which contains a kitchen and bath. A shed addition was added and set in the ell. Pine floors remain throughout the original structure and the addition.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

### SUMMARY

Though architecturally simple in style and plan, the Barth-Hempfling House is an excellent example of the Victorian vernacular architecture found in the nineteenth century on Main Street in North Little Rock. Once surrounded by similar vernacular residences, the Barth-Hempfling House is the only remaining structure of its type still standing on the city's main thoroughfare. As the only surviving reminder of a great period of growth and also of the immigrants who spurred the development, the Barth-Hempfling House is an historically priceless property.

### ELABORATION

The Barth-Hempfling House was built in 1886 by the Barth family, who had migrated from Baden Baden, Germany and arrived in New York City early in the 1880's. At the dock, real estate speculators advised them to settle in Arkansas. After living in Lonoke the family finally moved to North Little Rock, known at that time as Argenta, where they found employment at a butcher shop and later with the railroad.

The Victorian vernacular architecture of the Barth-Hempfling House combines a simple floor plan with ornately detailed porches and facades. The prominence of this vernacular coincided with the advent of the railroad. Transportation of heavy woodworking machinery to local trade centers made Victorian detailing inexpensive and accessible to the middle class. The symmetrical Victorian cottages became very popular with the working immigrant families who settled along Main Street.

The Barth-Hempfling House is important as it is the only surviving house of its type along a street once lined with many. Main Street is still the city's main thoroughfare and a few commercial buildings from the 1890's still stand, but the house constructed by the Barths is the only residential structure from the period still intact.




