## 45. Description and House Plan:

## Exterior:

I-story, brick, 4-bay, nave plan church; 7-course common bond with Flemish bonding course, gabled, asphalt shingle roof; low, ashlar foundation; wooden sills and lintels, colored glass windows; pilasters divide bays on principal (SE) facade; 2 4-panel doors located in outer bays have flat wood lintels, heavy Doric entablature on front and sides of building, entrances in rear (NW) gable end are original: one has been made into a window and the other gives access to a modern concrete block addition on the southwest corner of the building. The building is similar to Sh-103 (Salem Baptist Church, before its alterations) and nearly identical to Rockbridge Church (Sh-106, on the same circuit). Of the three, Olive Branch is the best preserved on the exterior.

#### Interior:

Sanctuary shortened to provide for Sunday school and nursery space before addition of concrete block wing: ceiling lowered, imitation wood panelling, mid-to late 19th century trim including deep shouldered architrave trim on all openings, original pews replaced (some stored in the basement).

There are no outbuildings. The nominated area includes one contributing building.
