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

45. Description and House Plan:

Exterior:

l-story, brick, 4-bay, nave plan church; 7-course common bond with Flemish bonding course, gabled, asphalt shingle roof; low, ashlar foundation; wooden sills and lintels, colored glass windows; pilasters divide bays on principal (SE) facade; 2 4-panel doors located in outer bays have flat wood lintels, heavy Doric entablature on front and sides of building, entrances in rear (NW) gable end are original: one has been made into a window and the other gives access to a modern concrete block addition on the southwest corner of the building. The building is similar to Sh-103 (Salem Baptist Church, before its alterations) and nearly identical to Rockbridge Church (Sh-106, on the same circuit). Of the three, Olive Branch is the best preserved on the exterior.

Interior:

Sanctuary shortened to provide for Sunday school and nursery space before addition of concrete block wing: ceiling lowered, imitation wood panelling, mid-to late 19th century trim including deep shouldered architrave trim on all openings, original pews replaced (some stored in the basement).

Outbuildings:

There are no outbuildings.
