19. History <u>Fishback's father, Jacob, built this house for him and his wife in 1806. Original section is log. The family came from Germany; Jacob was Rev. War soldier, 1783 came to Kentucky in Garrard County. 1787 to northside Kentucky River lived here till 1821. Representative from Clark in 1798 and trustee Transylvania University 1801-1807 Jesse and Jacob helped found Salem Presbyterian Church (see Ck-90) J. L. Fishback 1879 Atlas 1860 Atlas J Fishback</u>		35. Organization <u>KHC</u>	
20. Significance <u>Jacob Fishback built this house for his son around 1806. Prominent in county affairs, the Fishbacks were founding members of the Salem Presbyterian Church and served in the state legislature and as trustees of Transylvania College. The original portion of the house is hall-parlor plan log and is surrounded by a nearly intact series of nineteenth century farm outbuildings.</u>		36. Date <u>Fall 1976</u>
