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### Description

Located on County Road 235 at the point where it crosses Cedar Creek (approximately 1.5 miles south of Highway 14), the Cedar Creek Bridge is of stone masonry, closed spandrel deck arch construction. It consists of two spans, the longest of which measures 15 feet. Its total length is 30 feet, its deck width is 24.1 feet, and its overall width is 26.1 feet. Its abutment and pier material is concrete and stone, and its deck material is tar/gravel mix over concrete. A solid concrete barrier (probably later) has been placed atop the parapets.

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#### **Significance**

Constructed in 1941, the Cedar Creek Bridge is associated with the *World War II Era* historic context and is of the stone masonry, closed spandrel arch type. Though the identity of its original designer does not survive, it was constructed in conjunction with the Arkansas State Highway Commission and thus may well have been designed by one of that state agency's engineers. Given its relatively intact condition it retains sufficient integrity to remain associated with its historic period; it is thus locally eligible under Criterion C.


