Beginning at A on the south side of U.S 60, south 186' along the property line to B, thence west 210' along the tree line to C, thence north 186' along a fence to D, thence east 210' along the south side of U.S. 60 to the point of origin. The boundaries were chosen to encompass the building and its immediate environs, including a non-contributing modern concrete block cellar. See page four for site plan.

Point A is located on the southern edge of U.S. 60, 20 feet west of the point where the western edge of the westernmost arm of the drive meets the road.

#### 45. Description and House Plan: See page 4 for plan

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The 1-story, hip-roofed structure with clipped gable pediment in two locations, is reached from the highway by a curved drive, which passess beneath a canopy supported by massive hewn braced timber posts. The building is entered by an elaborate Palladian entry under the canopy, and carries a cornice with modillion blocks. The windows are 2/2 (horizontal) sash with arched transoms. The building is sheathed with wood shingles, and a stone chimney stands at the west side. The hipped roof front (north)section has a rear shed-roofed wing which in concealed behind a hipped roof on the east side. A gabled wing projects from it to the south. The rear wing is a modern addition.

of Interstate-64. The Colonial Revival structure is the best preserved of the two bus stop/restaurants. It is a major symbol of the nationally popular roadway architecture of the 1920's which frequently employed the Colonial Revival style. The alterations do not effect the integrity of the significant elements of the building. 14. History: (continued)

way House is now a private residence. The Shady Rest, often known as the Old Colonel, was the second of the two bus stop/restaurants to be built along U.S. 60. It was built by David Cunningham whose family operated the business. Cunningham sold the property in 1957 to the present owner who converted it into a private residence.
