ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION- a flat cornice with a center rounded arch, these cornices are decorated with fluting and acanthus leaves. Above each window is a rectangular cast iron vent. The parapet of the building has a pressed metal frieze and a cornice with modillions. Two large pressed metal brackets, one at either end, support the frieze and cornice, and define the ends of the building, similar to the smaller end brackets on the first floor. North, South, and West: Commercial Buildings, East: Broadway and Commercial Bldgs. Integrity: HISTORICAL NARRATIVE: (Cont.) - building for many years. Intact
