

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Olivier Store is located in the rural community of Lydia approximately half a mile southeast of Jacks Coulee. The two story frame clapboard building dates from the late-nineteenth century. It has a three bay front which is entered at the center. The staircase to the second floor is set in a rear corner of the main shopping space. The first floor has an impressive two story space in the center. The second floor wraps around this space with balustraded balconies.

The false front features a three bay porch with square paneled posts and scroll sawn ornamental capitals. The arched front doorway is flanked by a larger pair of arched plate glass windows which have double folding shutters with raised panels. The second story has three plate glass arched windows with raised paneled shutters. All shutters are shaped to close flush with the arches.

In about 1930 a one story rear wing was added, into which the store office was moved. In addition, a new top was installed on the false front and several horizontal windows were installed.

Until recently the store had a small adjacent warehouse which was connected to it by a covered breezeway. This has been lost, but it shows in Photo #3, which dates from c.1975.

Assessment of Integrity:

The Olivier Store is significant because of the features cited in Item 8, all of which remain intact.

SUMMARY PARAGRAPH:

The Olivier Store (c.1890) is an unusually large two-story frame plantation store located in a flat agrarian setting. Despite several changes, the building retains its architectural integrity. As noted elsewhere, it retains the features which make it significant.

NB: We were not able to get any interior views of the store because there is no electricity and little available natural light.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph) Criterion C

The Olivier Store is architecturally significant on the state level as a superior example of a rural plantation store for the following reasons:

1. It has a full two stories in contrast to the average example in the state which has only one.
2. It has a two story space which is encompassed by balustraded balconies. This is a feature customarily found only in more pretentious urban stores of the period in Louisiana.
3. It has a well proportioned three bay facade and unusually fine craftsmanship (for example, arched windows, rounded shutters, and scroll saw ornamentation). The round head fenestration is particularly unusual for a plantation store in Louisiana.

In short, very few old plantation store in the state can boast such a degree of pretention as found in the Olivier Store.


