

#### Physical Description

This 1917 Thompson and Harding two-story house design captures very well the rustic, informal and picturesque qualities of the Craftsman aesthetic. Lending a rugged irregularity to the basic massing of the main hipped roof block are two projecting wings on the front, one a two-story block, the other a one-story porch. Both have prominent gable end roofs which are carefully aligned to provide one long diagonally slanting line. The house is faced with stucco and the prominent gable ends at the front elevation feature half-timbered effects. A centrally placed chimney rises prominently at the front elevation. Over-scaled plain columns lend a robustness to the open front porch. A multi-paned window appears in the front door. Other sash windows vary with either six-over-one or eight-over-one lights.

#### Statement of Significance

1708-10 Spring is another multi-family dwelling built for H. L. Remmel by the Thompson and Harding firm in 1917. Craftsman in design, the firm achieves texturalism through the use of stucco, brick and pseudo half-timbering. The structure features a complexity of rooflines through the interplay of three separate roofs. Again, this multi-family house represents Thompson and Harding's sensitivity to designing a multi-family dwelling that would be compatible to the single-family neighborhood surrounding it.
