### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Built in 1909 the Waddle House is a two-story wood structure with a porch across the front and extended  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the way back on the south side meeting another room of the house that extends toward the south. The main part of the house is 36' x 48' with a utility room that extends 4' beyond the main house on the north side at the back. The two story structure has 3,000 square feet of living area.

At the time of the construction, the Waddle House was recognized as one of the finest houses in Success, Arkansas. It was constructed of the very best wood that was milled at that time. The roof features a combination of hip and gable. The roof is originally of wood shingles, but now is covered with composition shingles.

The siding of the house is painted white and has always been white. The house has three entrances. The windows are plain glass with the upper part trimmed with stained glass. The doors have transoms above.

The first floor consists of a foyer in which there is a beautiful stairway leading to the second story, a bedroom, living room, den, dining room, kitchen, bathroom and utility room. The ceilings are high as most of the houses built in this period.

The walls and ceilings were of wood and papered with usual paper. At the present time the walls of the living room are papered. The bedroom on the first floor has pale blue paneling with dark blue stripes.

The dining room walls are covered with pecan paneling and features a beautiful open doorway and wood room divider. The kitchen has sheetrock walls painted in off-white with black cabinets. A large pantry off the kitchen has been made into a bathroom. Success didn't have running water, therefore the house did not have a bathroom when it was built in 1909. The second story has five bedrooms. Three bedrooms have been recovered with sheetrock and painted. Two of the bedrooms are papered. The Waddle House has been well preserved and is in very good condition.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The significance of the Waddle House is the period of time it was built. A time when the town of Success, Arkansas, was at a peak of industry in timber and agriculture. The Waddle House was built in 1909 by a prominent pioneer doctor, M. V. B. Waddle, M.D. Dr. Waddle went into military service during World War I. As a doctor and upon his discharge he and his family moved to Doniphan, Missouri, where he started a medical practice. The residence was sold to Doctor Richard Lynch in 1924 another prominent doctor of the area. Dr. Lynch died in the late twenties but his family lived in the house until the early thirties, when they moved away.

The Waddle House has always been owned by early settlers of the area or descendants of early settlers.

Mr. & Mrs. George Sago purchased the house in 1975 and are now living in the house.

Mrs. Sago is a granddaughter of William Alexander Allen who was postmaster and operated a store and grist mill in the town in 1898-1900 or thereabout.

The primary significance of the Waddle House is historic and would make a good impression for visitation to former Clay Countians to tour that remember Success at a peak of industry in timber, sawmilling, factory, and agriculture. Success had two banks, three doctors, two cotton gins, a stove factory and other retail businesses that make up a thriving town. This was brought about by the building of the railroad by The St. Louis-San Francisco Railroad Co., one of the first rail services in Clay County, Arkansas.

Success is one of the oldest towns in Clay County, first known as Heckt Community, later becoming a town named Bridgeport. The name of the town was changed to Success, about the turn of the century.

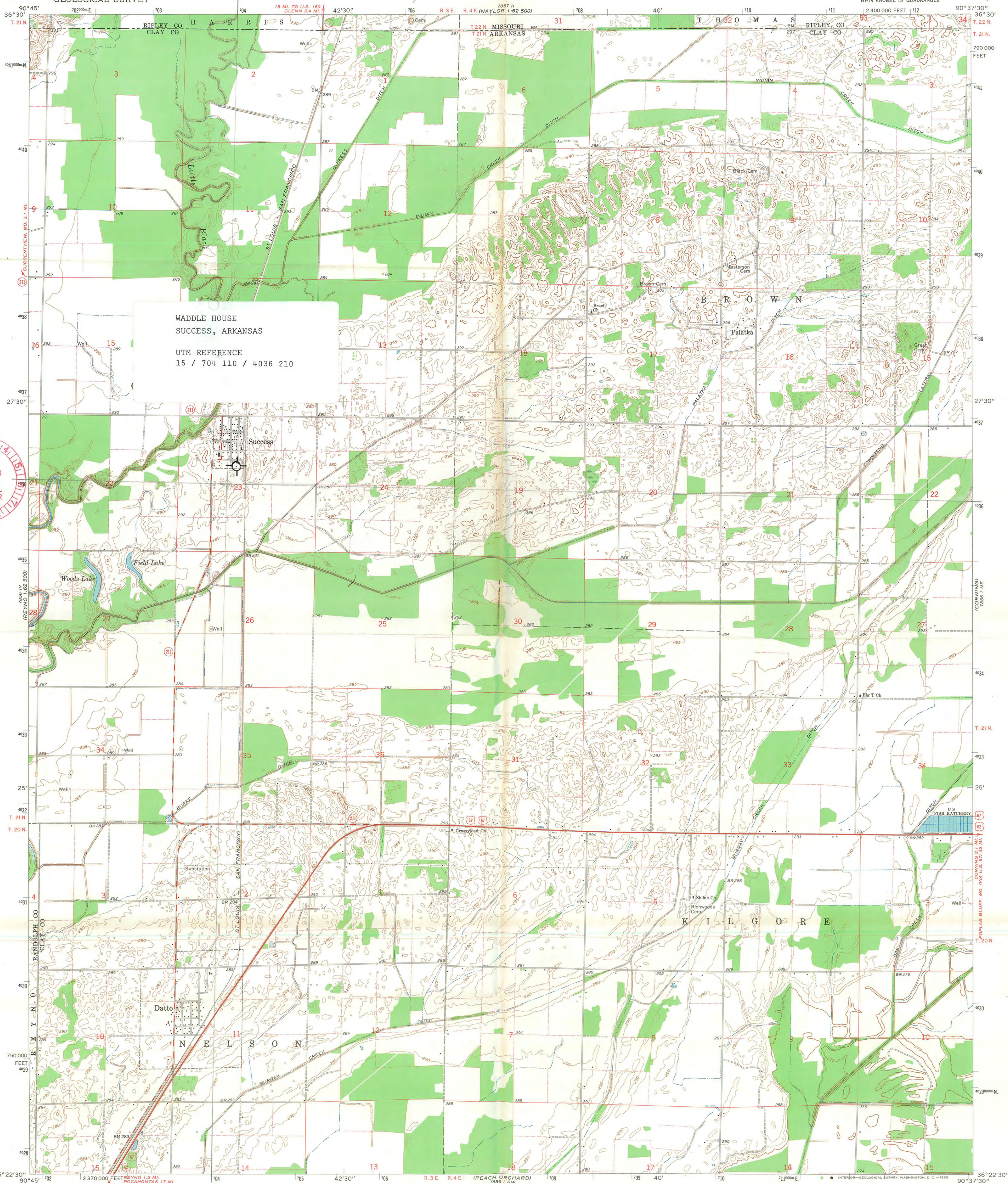

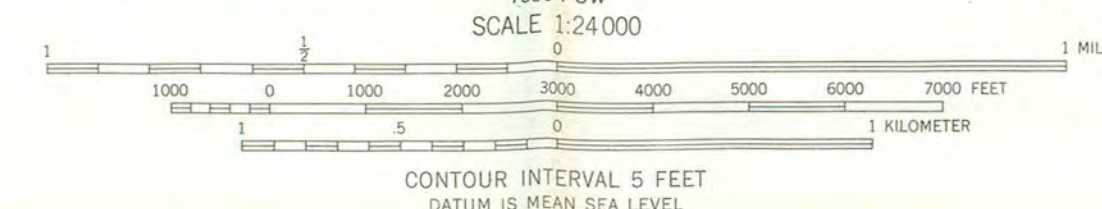

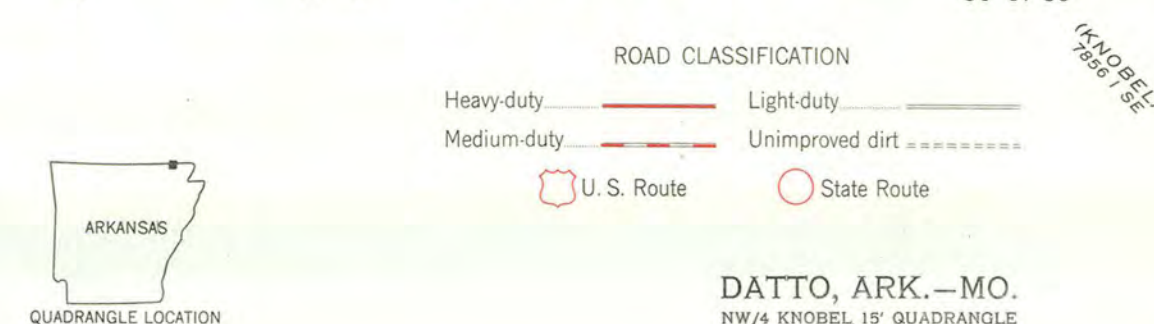
