

18. Description The Robert Hord house is a two-story, double-pile Greek Revival structure of brick laid in common bond. It has a center hall plan, two interior chimneys at each end, and a five-bay facade with pilasters separating each bay. The west facade has four bays and a semicircular gable window. The four-bay east facade utilizes the two central bays as doors with one leading to a small breakfast room (see next page)		40. 19. History Robert Hord directed in his will, dated April 1848, that his new house and most of his farm be sold by his executors. The suit filed in 1850 to settle the estate refers to the farm "upon which is the new brick residence of said Hord." Robert Hord is said to have been a grandson of Captain Philip Buckner, founder of Middle town. Hord was a prominent (see next page)		41. Significance The Robert Hord house is significant architecturally as a fine example of a late Greek Revival house. It is one of a few double-pile houses in Jefferson County and the treatment of the facade with bays separated by pilasters is an unusual feature.

addition. A modern brick ell is at the rear but it is not visible from the front. Some alterations have been made to the door on the main facade. A 1912 photograph indicates the sidelights were a part of the original entry and the pediment above the door was added after 1912. Although the photograph would not copy well enough for inclusion herein, it provided evidence that an Eastlake-style porch, probably dating from the 1880s, was on the front facade in 1912. This porch was probably removed when the brackets, overhanging eaves, and gabled dormers were added in the twentieth century.
