Old Main at Gustavus Adolphus College is located on a promontory in the geographic center of the campus. It is an imposing and elegant focal point within the campus complex.

Built in 1875-76 according to the design of one of St. Paul's leading architects, E.P. Bassford, the exterior of the building embodies many features characteristic of the Italianate style. The basic plan of the building is rectangular, measuring 90'6" in length and 60'2" in width with a central hallway on the three main floors and basement. It is constructed of locally quarried Kasota stone blocks. The well defined Kasota stone blocks are broken at the corners by quoins and at the central entry by a projecting pavilion. The three bay facade is defined by three couplings of round headed and segmentally arched windows. The slightly pitched roof is surmounted by an ornate cupola.

The exterior of the building has undergone minor alterations since its construction. The four/four wooden sash windows have been replaced with aluminum combination windows. The decorative fanlight over the main entry and the double oak doors have been sympathetically replaced with modern appointments. The projecting eaves and cupola have been painted a light ochre and the six chimneys have been removed.

From 1876-1884 Old Main housed all of the college's facilities including classrooms, labs, offices, a dining area, a chapel, and the president's living quarters. In order to accommodate the growing needs of the college Old Main has undergone interior alterations. Additional classrooms and lab space were provided by partitioning off the original classrooms. Many of the ceilings have been lowered and fluorescent lights added. The basic floor plan of the interior, hardwood floors, and woodwork have remained intact.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Old Main stands as the historic symbol of Gustavus Adolphus College. Architecturally, Old Main is significant as a fine example of the Italianate style which flourished in Minnesota's river towns during the 1870s.

Old Main is the oldest standing building associated with the history of Gustavus Adolphus College and has been in continual use for almost 100 years. The college was founded by Reverend Erik Norelius, famous for his pioneer work in the Lutheran Church, in 1862 at Red Wing, Minnesota. In 1863 the college was relocated at East Union where it met with limited success until 1875. In that year the college was moved to St. Peter and Old Main was constructed at a cost of \$25,000.

Old Main has long been considered the pride of the town as well as of the synod. It is one of two historic St. Peter buildings designed by the St. Paul architect E.P. Bassford. The integrity of design and the 🔅 structural quality of the building insure the continued use of Old Main as a college facility.
