ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: WEST SHELBYVILLE DISTRICT

The West Shelbyville District, composed of 155 structures, is the largest of the four districts proposed for the National Register. The variety of styles represented makes it necessary to limit the architectural description to the best examples of each architectural style.

There are five good examples of the Greek Revival style popular for residences in the mid-nineteenth century. Four are five bay, two story, central passage houses with low hip roofs. (Picket House, 820 Clay Street; Randolph House, 1113 Main Street; Hall House or Old Elks Club, 822 Main Street; Steele-Beard House, 804 Eighth Street)

Porch modification has changed the aspects of all four houses. The Hall House and the Pickett House now have late nineteenth century ornamental iron porches. The upper central bay and original access to the second story porch in the Randolph House has been changed into a room. (Photos #41, 77, 115)

The front yard of the Steele-Beard House has been subdivided. The right two bays of the facade of this house have also been altered with the addition of picture windows as well as a twentieth century screened porch. (Photo #105)

The Hall House has additional ornamentation in the abstract pediments atop the windows and scroll brackets at the doors on both the first and second stories. The Pickett House also displays paired windows as well as having retained the low stone spring house in the front lawn.


The other Greek Revival house is the Morris House at 1019 Main Street. It is a two story, three bay brick residence on the side passage plan. The door surrounds have been altered, but still display the side lights and transom. (Photo #83)

Additional Greek Revival detailing in Shelbyville includes the pilasters and door surrounds on the log and frame house on Washington Street and the pedimented facade of Layson Hall.

The Italianate style houses so popular in Kentucky from 1850 to 1880 can be divided into three groups based on the following floor plans: central passage, side passage, and T-plan. The first group has the rooms arranged off a central hallway. The houses are typically five bay, two story, brick, with hood moldings over the windows and bracketed cornices. The earliest of these residences in Shelbyville is the Cowles House at 726 Clay Street. The left three bays with the entry project. The double stretcher Flemish bond facade had been modified with the addition of an early twentieth century wrap around porch. The Harbison House at 834 Clay Street has a projecting entry bay and decorative iron porch on the right side of the facade. In the Pratt House at 708 Clay Street, the two right bays project, thus recessing the

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entry way with its original bracketed door surrounds. The left three bays including the entry bay of the Armstrong House at 1165 Main Street project. The hood moldings on this house are especially elaborate. The Allen House 1120 Main Street is a three bay house with raised corner pilasters, corbelled table below the frieze, and iron work porch. (Porch #102, 118, 101, 75)

The three side passage houses typically feature three bay brick facades without any projection for the entry bay. The Willis House at 906 Main Street is a symmetrical square structure with a low hip roof. All other ornamentation from the Italianate period has been removed and a twentieth century porch added. The Merriweather-McMakin House at 932 Main Street has a central wall gable, hood moldings, and a wrap around porch from the early twentieth century. The Maddox House at 1005 Main Street has had the least modification of this type house plan. It is four bay with elaborate hood moldings and an original one story porch. (Photos #44, 49, 86)

The T-plan house became popular in the last quarter of the nineteenth century. They are typified as being two stories, three or four bay, gable roofed, with overhanging eaves supported by brackets. The Gilbert House at 927 Main Street has remnants of the Gothic Revival in the bargeboards on its eaves. It is a three bay house with a one story ironwork porch. The Henderson-Hanna House at 1204 Main Street is a five bay version of the brick T-plan. It has slender grouped segmentally arched windows with brick hood molds, bracketed entrance way and elaborate ironwork porch with second floor access. The Riggs House at 828 Clay Street is frame with a notable three story tower in the angle. The tower roof is a concave pyramid. The Bright-Bradbury house at 1179 Main features a polygonal bay window, brackets under the overhanging eaves, and a twentieth century Classical Revival porch. (Photos #89, 65, 117, 74)

Especially notable among the houses from the Italianate period is the ironwork found on porches of several of the houses.

There are four houses in the West Shelbyville District which exemplify the Queen Anne style popular in the latter decades of the nineteenth century. Two houses, the Mary Blumer House, 804 Main Street and the Kaltenbacher House, 700 Clay, exhibit the whimsical nature of the Queen Anne style with their asymmetrical multi-planed roof lines. Both have conical roofed turrets, mansard roofs, multiple window shapes, and colored glass. The Hooker House at 920 Main Street and the Overstreet House at 926 Main Street are a more restrained form of Queen Anne. (Photos #37, 101, 47, 48)

At the turn of the century, the Queen Anne style gave way to the symmetrical floor plans of the classical revival style. Bland Avenue developed between 1890 and 1910 illustrates the transition from one style to another. On the east end of the street can be found some modified T-plan houses with the multifaceted detailing of the Queen Anne style. Wrap around porches, bargeboards, and bay windows give way to

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unadorned facades without projections. (Photos #127-141)

Despite alterations through aluminum siding, porch enclosures, and window replacements, the neighborhood provides a consistent picture of a turn of the century neighborhood. Unlike other neighborhoods, there is no infill of later styles. The Sandborn Insurance Map show that the houses on the west end of the street were in place by 1909.

Other houses of this period can be found on Main Street. One of the best Classical Revival houses is 101 Main Street. It is two story with a wrap around porch, dentils in the cornice, Ionic columns, stone foundation, and a high hip roof. The Campbell House at 1184 Main is a three bay, 2 1/2 story frame residence with end chimneys, and wrap around porch. (Photos #80, 64)

The Classical detailing became more full blown with the introduction of monumental porticos with three bay facades as can be found in the Willis House, 1108 Main Street, the Hall House, 720 Magnolia, and the Long House, 1217 Main Street. The porticos were pedimented and supported by Doric or Corinthian columns. Often the central hall of the second floor had access to a balcony. A portico of more delicate proportions can be seen on the Walters House at 712 Magnolia. The three bay facade is accented by a central wall gable and the portico is rectilinear with a trio of columns.

The most popular style from the first quarter of the twentieth century was the American Four Square. The facades usually are three bay without projections, two story, with a hip roof and overhanging eaves. Two houses standing side by side at 810 and 814 Clay Street show interesting variations in porch arrangement. One has a one bay porch and the other a pedimented wrap around porch. Both facades have classically grouped windows, one with Palladian reference. A larger version of the style is the Smith-Shannon House at 1124 Main Street. There is a six bay facade with a porch across the front and wrapping around the side. The Hedden-Coffman House on 622 Magnolia is an unusual stone veneer version of this style. (Photos #113, 144, 60)

Co-existing with the Classical Revival style is the Bungalow which differs mainly in the integration of the gable roof and porch. 1302 and 1306 Main Street demonstrate the overhanging eaves and roofline. Occasionally, the brackets or stick-style motif found its way into the porch treatment as in the Craftsman style porch on 803 Magnolia.

There are four Classical Revival houses which have the aspects of the Italianate style in their arched openings and hip roofs with overhanging eaves. The McCormick-Hayes House, 830 Main Street and the Hall and Taylor Funeral Home display the arched windows which are longer on the first than the second floor creating an arcading effect. The rectangular form and hip roof is also used in the Hollenbach-Scearce House, 610 Magnolia and the Cozine-Connell House 1219 Main Street. The hip roof has a concave bell shape to its profile. (Photos #42, 72, 69)

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Several Colonial Revival houses display materials and details not seen in the other districts. The Moxley-Biagi House, 617 Magnolia is a central plan house covered in wood shingles. Two houses have Tudor Revival elements in their facades. The Schmidt House, 1205 Main has the Tudor arches and combination of stone and brick while the Beckham-Wallace House, 1118 Main Street has a turret.

WEST SHELBYVILLE DISTRICT: SIGNIFICANCE

The overall character of the neighborhood is enhanced by the existence of a majority of single family residences, which are still owner occupied. In addition, the main tenance of details and porches make Main Street an elegant entrance from the west side of town.

There are a number of architecturally outstanding houses within the district representing the styles of Greek Revival, Italianate, Queen Anne, Bungalow, Classical Revival, and Colonial Revival. There are also two neighborhoods developed at different time periods which remain intact with little intrusion from other architectural styles. Bland Avenue started in the late nineteenth century shows a progression of house styles from east to west. On the Eighth Street end are several Queen Anne houses which are followed by the turn of the century eclectic styles. The houses become increasingly symmetrical until they are totally Classical Revival at the corner of Tenth. Despite the modifications to siding and porches, the basic styles and forms are still visible and there has been no infill with more recent residences.

Magnolia Avenue platted in 1906 is a collection of more elaborate examples of the Classical Revival style. There are American Four Squares, three bay houses with massive porticos, and a single Shingle Style house. There are also Bungalows whose overhanging gable roof includes the porch.

The West Shelbyville District is significant as the best collection of late nineteenth and early twentieth century residential architecture in Shelbyville. Its mid and late century houses contain significant examples of Italianate and Classical Revival architecture as well as excellent and more numerous examples of Greek Revival, Queen Anne, Bungalow, American Four Square and Colonial Revival houses.



Then south 240 feet to the south right of way of Main Street;
Then west 30 feet along the south right of way of Main Street;
Then south 140 feet along the west property line of 1306 Main Street;
Then east 300 feet to a point in the west property line of 1204 Main Street;
Then south 100 feet to a point in the south property line of 806 Magnolia;
Then east 160 feet to the east right of way of Magnolia;
Then 60 feet north with the east right of way of Magnolia to a point;
Then east 170 feet to a point in the east property line of 803 Magnolia;
Then north 940 feet to a point;
Then east 1560 feet to a point in the east right of way of Tenth Street;
Then south with the east right of way of Tenth Street, 650 feet to a point in the
south right of way of Bland Avenue;
Then west 75 feet to a point;
Then south 100 feet along the east right of way of Tenth Street;
Then east 720 feet to a point in the west property line of 708 Eighth Street;
Then south 100 feet to a point in the south property line of 712 Eighth Street;
Then east 155 feet along the south property line of 712 Eighth Street to a point in
the west right of way of Eighth Street;
Then 500 feet north along the west right of way of Eighth Street;
Then east 540 feet to a point in the west right of way of Seventh Street;
Then north 200 feet to the point of beginning.

BOUNDARY JUSTIFICATION

North of the district is a mixture of more modern commercial and residential structures. On the west are subdivisions from the latter part of the twentieth century. On the south is additional residential development and the railroad. East of the district is light industry and more recent commercial development.

The district covers the development of the west end of Shelbyville. Several Greek Revival houses stand on lots from the original Western Addition in 1802, while others

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stand on land added in the Addition to the Western Addition. The Italianate style is well represented with three different floor plans. Late nineteenth century building styles can be found on Bland Avenue which was being subdivided in the 1890's. Early twentieth century American Four Squares and Bungalows have infilled many of the older neighborhoods. On Magnolia, an early twentieth century neighborhood has been preserved.


