

A low, rectangular mass, this house is covered with a shallow-pitched slate roof that incorporates a full-width front porch. The slender wooden columns of the porch are repeated at the corners of the house with engaged half-columns, and a band of shingles runs around the porch in place of an entablature. The exterior opening surrounds are of the simplest trabeated sort, and the windows are either 1/1 double-hung sash or 6/6. The only exterior alteration is the enclosing of the north end of a shed-roofed porch on the west side, itself a possible early addition. Craftsman style detailing is clearer in the interior finishing than in the exterior.

The gabled concrete-block shed does not contribute to the property since it was constructed in the last several decades. A barn and two sheds near the house are not included in the boundaries. A white board fence seperates the drive and house from the pastureland and outbuildings, except the concrete block building.


