Description: The Old Batesburg Grade School is a two-story brick Neoclassical school building with a central tetrastyle portico and flanking pavilions. The building was built ca. 1912 as the town's first public school. The central portico has four colossal Tuscan columns on brick bases supporting a full entablature with a pediment. Brick pilaster responds with Tuscan capitals are located at the juncture of portico with facade. The main body of the building has five bays on the facade, with three beneath the portico. The central entrance is recessed beneath a segmental arch with cement keystone and impost blocks. The firstfloor windows have flat lintels, while the second-floor windows have segmental heads with cement spandrels, keystones, and impost blocks. The projecting pavilions at either end of the facade are two bays wide, repeating the fenestration of the main block. An auditorium is located at the rear of the building. (Continued on Back)

Significance: The Batesburg Grade School was constructed ca. 1912 as the town's first public school. Housing grades 1-11, it succeeded and replaced two earlier schools, a Baptist school built ca. 1886 and a Methodist school built sometime thereafter. The two church schools merged in 1896 in the Baptist school building, which burned in 1911. The Old Batesburg Grade School is also significant architecturally as one of three Neoclassical public school buildings built in the county in the early twentieth century.

Description (Con't)

Ca. 1945, the building underwent certain renovations. The original windows were replaced with jalousie windows. A one-story cafeteria wing, of brick, was built at the left rear of the building, and two-story brick wings were added to the left and right elevations. These additions, while possessing minimal distinction, are appropriately subservient to the original building, and have little impact on the historic fabric. The new jalousie windows are placed within the original window openings.
