DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The physical appearance of the Quadrangle-Mattoon Street Historic District can best be described by considering each individual area within the district. These areas are the Quadrangle, the Elliot Street area, and the Mattoon Street area. Situated on top of a hill, the district is bounded by Chestnut Street to the west, State Street to the south, and includes properties on either side of Mattoon, Salem, and Edwards Streets.

Located around a central green and interspersed with wooded lawns, the Quadrangle forms the southwest section of the district. Prior to 1870, the Quadrangle was an area of large detached frame houses. Elijah Blake's Gothic Revival house of 1839 (#7) long since moved from State Street to the northeast corner of the Quadrangle, is the last remaining house from that time.

In 1870, a Gothic style library, now demolished, was designed by George Hathorne and built on State Street (on the site of the present library). A few years later, Lord, Fuller, and Wadlan's Romanesque Christ Church (#3) was erected on Chestnut Street. Merrick Park, the small terrace at the corner of State and Chestnut Streets, was dedicated in 1887. St. Gauden's noted statue of Deacon Samuel Chapin (1887) was moved to the park in 1899. Two museums were built in the 1890's: the graceful Italianate George Walter Vincent Smith Museum (#2) c.1895, by Renwick, Aspinwall and Renwick, and the classical facaded Museum of Science (#5), c.1898, by Gardner, Pyne and Gardner. A generous donation by Andrew Carnegie led to the 1909 construction of the fine neo-Renaissance Central Library (#1) designed by Edward L. Tilton. The library has a white marble fifteen bay facade, a green tile hip roof, and an ornate central staircase on State Street. It is not surprising that the design resembles the Boston Public Library of 1888, as Tilton served his apprenticeship with McKim, Mead and White. The north end of the Quadrangle was delineated in 1927 with the Colonial Revival styled Pyncheon Museum (#6). The Quadrangle as it is now was completed in 1934 with the construction of Tilton and Githen's classical Art Deco Museum of Fine Arts (#4) and the Museum of Science addition.

The Elliot Street area is directly east of the Quadrangle. The Alexander House (#26) of 1811 is the oldest structure within the Elliot Street area. Originally surrounded by Springfield farmland, the house was constructed for James Byers. Built by Simon Sanborn from early plans by Asher Benjamin, the house exhibits many features illustrated in Benjamin's popular pattern books. Done in the transitional Federal-Greek Revival style, its facade presents a symmetrical two-story porch with four fluted Ionic columns and two fluted Ionic pilasters. The porch is topped by a dentiled pediment containing an ocular window flanked by two triangular windows. The roof is enclosed by a balustrade with intermittent decorative openings.

Next to be built in the Elliot Street area was St. Michael's Cathedral (#23). A handsome brick structure of 1860, it reveals a combination of Federal, Italianate, and Gothic Revival influences. The mansarded Rectory (#24) at Elliot and State Streets was completed in 1870 when the Diocese of Western Massachusetts was formed. It boasts Italianate fenestration with curved granite keystone lintels and elegant Corinthian columned porches.

7. Description

Across Elliot Street from the Rectory is another brick mansard (#25) which retains not only its original granite linteled windows, slate roof, and mansard roofed dormers, but also its jigsaw work on the porch, brackets, and cornices.

On the northeast corner of Elliot and Edwards Streets, stand two white clapboard houses (#20 and #21), both built in 1868 for two of Springfield's most prominent citizens, William Wilcox and Warner Sturtevant. #20 was planned by Perkins and Gardner in a combination Mansard-Stick Style design. One notable feature of the house is the delicate iron cresting. #21 is a Stick Style-Gothic Revival dwelling designed by James Currier which retains its cresting as well as its patterned bargeboards and porchwork. All of the houses in the Elliot Street area are attractively surrounded by trees and shaped bushes.

The Mattoon Street area includes the properties north of the Quadrangle and Elliot Street areas. All these buildings were built in or after 1870. The first structure built on Mattoon Street was an 1870 three story Mansard rowhouse (#18). Soon after, a three story Mansard group (#16) was completed next door. The five bow front Mansards with raised stoops (#12) were built in 1872 from plans of Perkins and Gardner, architects for the more elegant #20. In 1873 the double brick Mansard (#15) was completed as well as the North Congregational Church (#7), H.H. Richardson's second Springfield Commission. The church is of Romanesque construction with the bell tower placed at the intersection of two cross axis. It is fronted with rusticated stonework, and Tiffany stained glass windows are used throughout.

All of the structures built in or before 1873 were fashionable and costly, but the Panic of 1873 slowed down development on Mattoon Street and resulted in less fashionable houses thereafter. Examples of these plainer dwellings are #8 (1875), #11 (1880), #9 (1884), and #13, #14, and #19 (all 1887). The latter three are the only Queen Anne structures in the Mattoon Street area. The last 19th c. building in the area was the Yadow apartment house (#10). The remaining buildings in the area are 20th c. and of little aesthetic value.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Quadrangle-Mattoon Street Historic District is significant to Springfield in two major ways: 1) it contains notable examples of 19th c. architecture, both domestic and institutional, and 2) it contains the cultural center of the city, located in one of the most unique urban open areas of its kind in Massachusetts.

The single and multiple family dwellings range in style from both typical and elaborate Mansards to Gothic Revival and the eccentric Queen Anne. Most notable among them are #15, 20, 21, 24, 25, and 26. Amongst these, the Alexander House (#26), a Federal-Greek Revival home, was designed from plans by Asher Benjamin and built by Simon Sanborn, believed to have been Springfield's first full time builder. Sanborn worked in the popular styles of the day, and due to his great skill and productivity, was the most important Springfield builder of the time. The house, originally called Linden Hall, was later named for Henry Alexander, an early mayor of Springfield. It is owned by the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiquities. The 1839 Gothic Revival house (#7) was built for Elijah Blake, an early civic leader who was chief of the city's first fire department.

Both the work of H.H. Richardson and James Renwick are represented in the district. The institutional buildings represent even more of a stylistic mixture, ranging from Romanesque and neo-Renaissance to Gothic Revival, Georgian Revival and Art Deco. Significant to the Quadrangle complex is the Seymour Planetarium in the Museum of Science. (#5). Built in 1937 by Frank Korkosz, the planetarium's projector was the first to be designed and built by an American, and was the first in which the stars appeared to twinkle.

Many characteristics make this district a unique open space. Beginning with 1811 and continuing up to the present, the three block district contains buildings from every era of Springfield's history. These buildings were designed, donated, inhabited and/or enjoyed by both prominent Springfield citizens and the public. In addition, the churches, museums, and library make the Quadrangle the cultural center of the city. With the handsome Mattoon Street area for its northern border, the Quadrangle block, with its landscaped lawns and parks, also provides Springfield with both an attractive and pleasurable leisure area.

The Quadrangle-Mattoon Street District has been designated a local historic district by the City of Springfield.

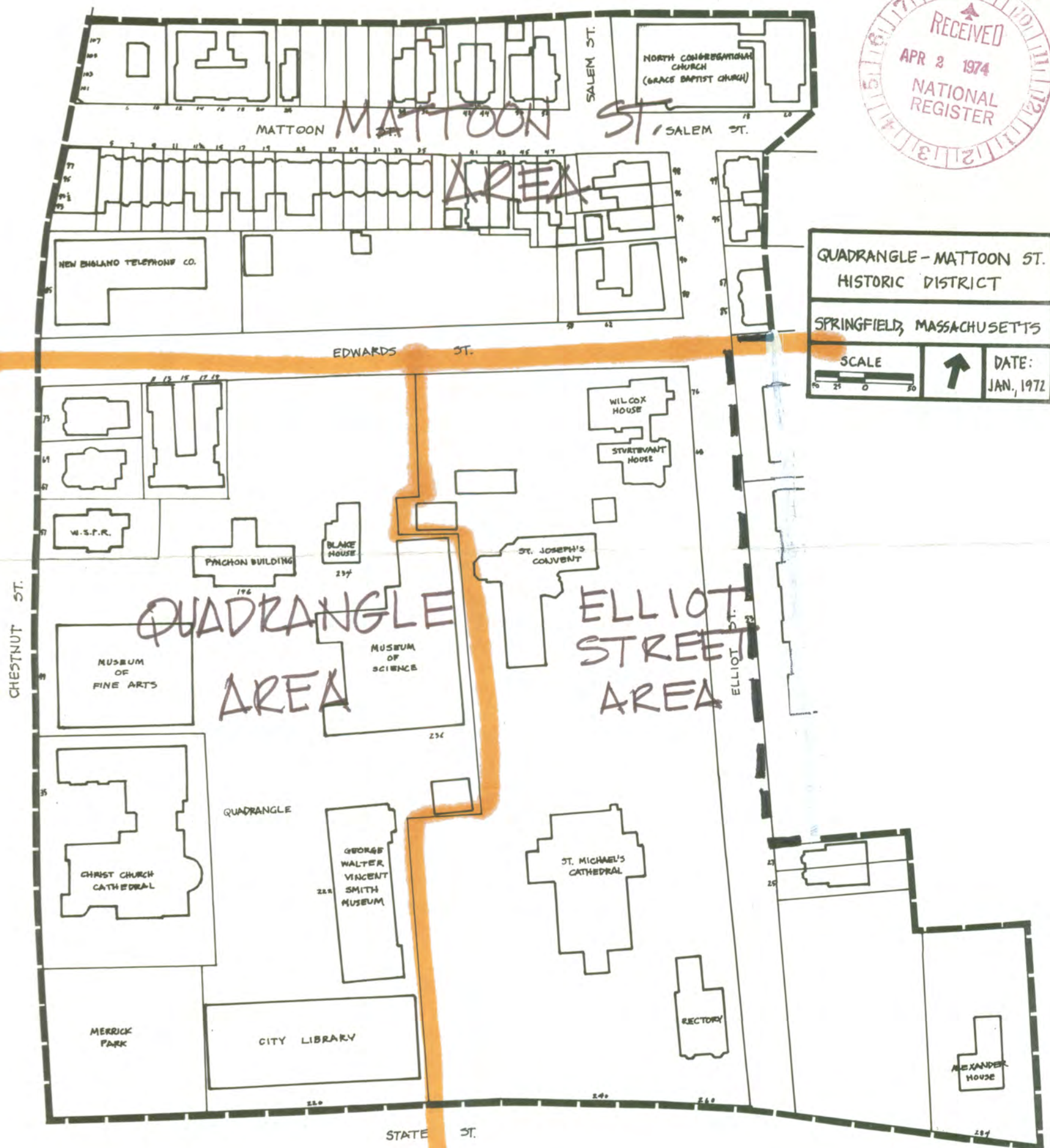


QUADRANGLE - MATTOON ST.
