DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Locust School is a one-room structure built of rubble ashlar, with approximate dimensions of 30' x 40'. The long sides are divided into three bays by 4/4 sash windows with braod stone lintels and narrow sills. The single entrance is centered in the south wall. The school has a gable roof, covered with composition shingle, and a narmow, plain wooden cornice. The covered bell platform has round-arched openings, and a small hipped roof. Directly behind this feature is a brick chimney, added at the time a proper furnace was installed in the 1930's. The original chimney was at the north end, connected to a stove.

The interior comprises one main room, with a wall forming a cloakroom at the entrance end. In the southwest corner is a set of stairs leading to the basement.

The school is located at the intersection of two county roads, with a small Lutheran Church to the east. Across the road, to the west, are a few dwellings which make up the unincorporated community of Locust. Locust is at a higher elevation, relative to the surrounding countryside, with long, sloping hills in all directions. Most of the immediate area is under cultivation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Locust School is among the earliest school buildings in Winneshiek County. It is believed to have been built in 1854, shortly after the village of Locust was surveyed and first settlement begun. It is a typical example of its kind: the one-room rural school, built in simple form from local materials, and service all ages: characteristics ubiquitous during the early settlement period of Iowa history.

The school was used for all elementary grades until 1950, when only specific grades were assigned here. It was closed in 1960, and is now open to the public on an appointment basis as a museum.
