This house is a large two story Italinate on a lovely lot on the banks of Patit Creek. The house form is square with a typical shallow hipped roof. It has a centered gable pediment with decorative gable scroll work with a pendant and returned boxed eaves. There are scrolled brackets under the decorative boxed eaves. A two story bay with cutaway corners at the first floor, and a gabled pediment at the roof add to the house. It has a partial front porch with square porch supports, decorative brackets, and a decorated dentil frieze above. a centered double window. At the second floor has an ornate label, first floor has a plain entablature. Windows are tall one over one double hung.
