Built in 1756, the Ezra Stiles House is a large, two-and-one-halfstory, five-bay-wide, gambrel-roofed house. Its plan is that of four rooms on each principal floor with central halls, orghaized around two large interior brick chimneys. Now facing west, the house originally faced its garden to the south, with its gable end to the street. When turned west to face the street it was placed on a new, high, brownstone foundation abutting the sidewalk. Even though the house was turned and remodelled in 1831, it retains its over-all eighteenth-century lines and character.

The windows have their original pegged frames and moulded cornices. Two pedimented dormers which light the garret on the front also remain. The original doorway was replaced with one of Greek Revival design. Set in a panelled recess and protected by a one-story, flat-roofed portico supported by Doric columns and simple pilasters, this doorway is framed by a transom and sidelights of etched glass. The original cornerboards were also replaced with the simple panelled pilasters common to the Greek Revival. A two-story clapboarded kitchen ell-with a brick end wall and interior chimney adjoins the house to the rear. Bay windows, each two stories tall, have been extended from the front rooms at either side of the house.

Although the house has retained its cased beams and panelled wainscoting on the interior, many of the mantels and much of the other trim in its rooms date: from after 1834. A graceful, winding staircase in the central hall rises from the ground floor all the way to the third level under the gambrel roof.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to the records of the Second Congregational Church in Newport, this house was erected as a parsonage in 1756 on land which had been donated by William Ellery and Peter Coggeshall. From the time of its erection, until 1776, the house was occupied by Ezra Stiles, then minister of the congregation. In addition to being a brilliant church—man, Stiles was recognized as probably the most learned man in New England in his time, and he sought information on all manner of subjects. A friend of Benjamin Franklin, Stiles conducted the first experiments with electricity in New England. In the garden of his house on Clarke Street he grew white mulberry trees for experiments with silk-worms, explained in a still-preserved manuscript; he here observed the transit of Venus in the company of Henry Marchant and William Vernon.

Stiles was also important as an educator. He had been librarian of the Redwood Library since his arrival in Newport; and he helped James Manning found the third college in New England--Rhode Island College (now Brown University). His church's congregation, depleted by the Revolution, was forced to dismiss him in 1776. Stiles became President of Yale College in the following year, but it was not until 1786 that he formally ended his ministry in Newport.

Architecturally, the Ezra Stiles House is most significant as part of an extremely well preserved, one-block-long street of exceptionally fine eighteenth-century buildings which include the Second Congregational Church (1735) and the important Vernon House (c. 1708, enlarged c. 1760), a registered National Landmark. Although the Stiles House was somewhat altered in 1834, when the church sold it to a private individual, it nevertheless retains much of its early character. Its preservation is essential for the protection of the rare architectural quality and historical significance of the street in which it stands.
