Stone on main facade is white, common bond; remaining walls are bluish in a random ashlar pattern. Stone is from Metcalfe quarry near Kingman. Building was leased as a rooming house immediately after being built. Gruninger and Sons began business in Kingman in 1907 and became one of the city's best-known contracting firms, building the Luthy Block, Van Marter Store, Methodist Parsonage and Methodist Church, and numerous residences.
