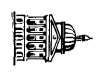

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

One-and-a-half-story gable-roof L-plan frame residence with undercut gallery, five bays by two. Ell on southwest facade has shed-roof porch that aligns with center hall of front section. Entrance frontispiece with double-leaf doors, side lights, and transom framed by shouldered architrave trim and pilasters which repeat the pedimenthead vertical panel seen on the columns. Jib doors along front gallery; five chimneys with fireplace and original mantelpieces in every room.

The McCrory-Deas-Buckley house is architecturally significant as a well-proportioned relatively small Greek Revival cottage. It has been owned by the Deas family since 1876 and is in a remarkably good state of preservation.

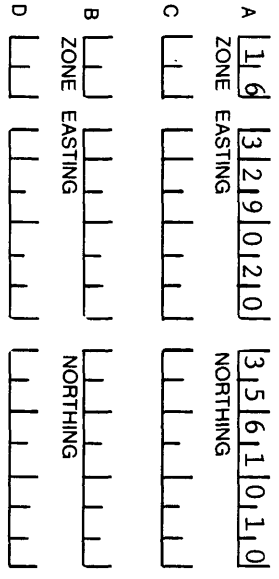
