## DESCRIPTION

ARCHITECTURAL STYLE Victorian Gothic Revival DATE c. 1880 2 stories, cross-gable plan with veranda around front and south side FORM frame on rockfaced stone foundation MATERIALS 2/2 d.h.s. surrounds have dogears and decorative cornices FENESTRATION fenestration; steeply-pitched gables; polygonal window bay FEATURES south side; wall dormer with cut-out vergeboards in mansard above entrance; stylized porch brackets porch balusters removed ALTERATIONS small raised lot, among houses of similar scale but dating from SITE the later 19th and early 20th centuries

ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE There are no domestic examples of pre-Civil War Gothic Revival in Davenport, and only a handful of Gothic-inspired houses from the Victorian period. The Quickel house is an excellent example of the latter. It is recognizable first by the extremely steep, narrow gables, then by the strongly-shaped vergeboards, porch and window details, which convey a feeling of rectilinearity, in contrast to the curves more commonly associated with the earlier Gothic Revival.

The earliest known occupant of this house was HISTORICAL DATA Jacob Quickel, beginning in 1902, who worked as a cutter at the Rock Island Arsenal. Five years later, the property was sold to C. Rollin Marks, a clerk with his family's business, the Security Fire Insurance Company.
