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Situated on a narrow lot in the south-central part of the city of Spearfish, the Webb S. Knight House is a very simple version of Queen Anne domestic housing. Rising from a stone foundation, the L-shaped wood frame dwelling is clad with clapboard siding. It is capped by a steeply pitched cross gable roof covered with wood and asphalt shingles. Two brick chimneys rise from the center of the roof. A small open porch with delicate turned posts and brackets is located on the southwest corner of the west (front) facade. Fenestration is asymmetrical. Most windows are long rectangular units surrounded by contemporary wooden non-functional shutters and original heavy architraves. Multiple-pane picture windows are located on the west and north facades. Except for remodeling of the kitchen, the interior remains much as it was originally built, including plaster walls and ceilings and simple woodwork.

A modern one-story wood frame garage (noncontributing) with clapboard siding and an asphalt shingled gable roof is located a few yards east of the house.

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Under Criterion C of the National Register Criteria, the Webb S. Knight House is significant in the area of architecture, because it is a good example of a simplified vernacular version of Queen Anne styling as executed in Spearfish, South Dakota, during the late 19th Century. Under the South Dakota Historical Preservation Plan, the nominated property relates to the following historic context: IV. Permanent Rural and Urban Pioneer Settlement, D.2. Urban Development/Residential living.

During the last two decades of the 19th Century Queen Anne styling dominated domestic building throughout South Dakota. Influenced by the work of English architect Richard Norman Shaw, Queen Anne houses provided increased comfort and domesticity for single-family households. Prominent aesthetic features of the style include irregularity and asymmetry of facade, irregular rooflines, multiplicity of siding materials especially the use of fishscale shingles, and decorative treatments to gable ends, porches, and projecting bays. The front facade is usually divided into uneven squares or planes. Fenestration is always asymmetrical, often consisting of a number of shapes and sizes of Frequently a tower is incorporated into the design. Many smaller, less expensive dwellings were also constructed using these prevailing design While the simpler versions typically omitted the use of a tower or of the large rambling plans, they usually featured the characteristic asymmetrical and irregular facade and roofline treatments. Window, door, or porch trim frequently displayed the fancy work of late-Victorian traditions. The Knight House illustrates some of these design features.

Spearfish, located on the eastern rim of the Black Hills, was founded in 1876 in response to the emerging gold rush. It quickly grew into a vital service community for area miners and ranchers. In the mid-1880s, the city became the home of Black Hills Normal School, now known as Black Hill State College.

Webb S. Knight was born in Erie, Pennsylvania, in 1869. He came to the Black Hills in 1890 and for a short time managed a privately-owned electric power plant in Spearfish Canyon. He later invested in area minerals milling businesses. Mr. Knight played an active role in civic affairs and served many years as Spearfish city treasurer, councilman, and assessor. He also promoted development of the city park. In 1892, Knight built this simple late-Victorian house at 514 Seventh. He died in 1940.

The period of significance of the nominated property does not extend beyond its date of construction in 1892.
