Despite the recent addition of a monumental portico to the main facade, the I-house format and architectural details that typically constitute the Greek Revival styling in Warren County are clearly visible. The stone blocks at the ends of the cornices seem to link the house with the nearby Moses Shobe House (Wa-5) and with the Clark House in Bowling Green (Wa-B-167). A prominent early owner of the house was Col. Henry Grider, a US Congressman.
