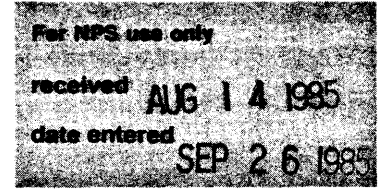

4. Owner: Tomas Espinoza, 312 Tecolote, Las Vegas, N.M.
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation; stucco and mud plaster over adobe walls; wood shingle and corrugated metal roof; 2/2, 4/4 double-hung windows; single door in deep reveal. Random ashlar retaining wall near street. Located on a hill, looking NE, across the **Arroyo Gabonito** to Mission Hill and the **Old Town Residential District**.
8. Significance: This is a very good, not recently altered, example of the mixing of Hispanic and Anglo-derived elements. It may have started as a single file of adobe rooms which steps with the slope (note horizontal disjunction of front windows) and turns a corner to form a rear facing L-shape. The addition of the pitched roof, windows and shed roofed rear addition, after 1885, marked the effects of newer practices.

Boundary: Lot 11 and the west half of Lot 10 of Block I of the original Town of Las Vegas.
