The brick building consists of a one-and-one-half story recessed central block with one-story twin projecting pavilions and a one-story brick ell on the central block. 18. brickwork enhances the facade, while the remainder is done in common bond with a row of headers every seven or nine rows. Fenestration consists of seven bays with a central entrance with a transom now enclosed. A one-story, three-bay pedimented portico embellished with shingling and pierced by a single 2/2 pane window, which replaced the original fanlight window, accentuates the facade. Six Doric Order columns support the portico. Facade windows are 9/6 pane with jackarches and wooden sills. A corbeled cornice accents the facade and rear of the central block, while each wing has a boxed cornice. The central block has interior gable-end chimneys with two 2/2 pane gable windows at each end, and the twin projecting pavilions and the ell also have interior gable-end chimneys. Square windows of 6/6 pane with wooden sills pierce the ell. Each side of the central block is punctured by two bays consisting of a door with a transom now enclosed and a 9/9 pane window with wooden sills and enhanced by one-story, two-bay open porches.

A corbeled cornice accents the ell. Each wing is accentuated by a brick pilaster. A limestone foundation supports the building. A one-story frame coal shed and a one and one-half story frame barn with log joists are dependencies of the dwelling.

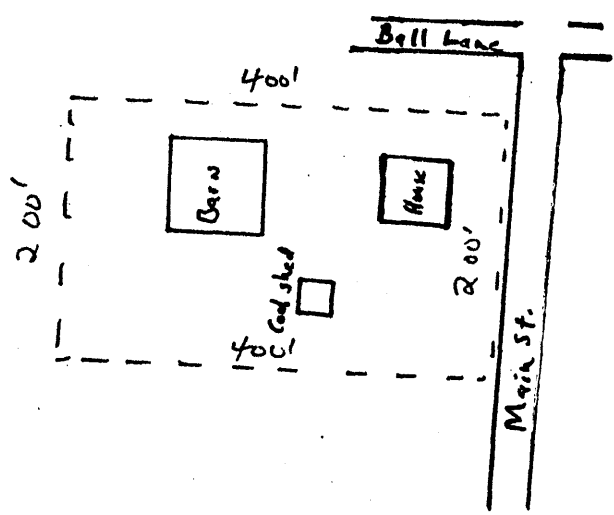

Beginning at the intersection of Ball Lane and U.S. 42 proceed 400' in a westward direction; thence 200' in a southward direction; thence 400' in an eastward direction; thence 200' in a northward direction to the point of origin. The boundary is drawn to include the house and outbuildings.
