

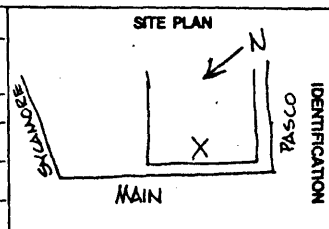

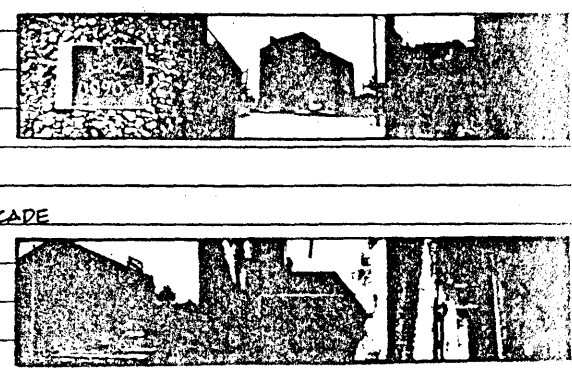

E. At the turn of the century, rail connections through Evansville were increased. The attractiveness of the city as a regional market is seen in the construction of this block for wholesale grocers Parsons & Scoville. According to reports, 10,000 visitors came to the grand opening on New Year's Day 1908, "and coffee, sandwiches and cigars were served in abundance."
