Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Alabama Penny Savings Bank (1913) is a six-story Commercial style building faced with buff-colored brick. It has a strong vertical appearance, emphasized by its proportions and the unbroken rise of four vertical piers. The outside piers and fenestration are framed by striped borders of buff-colored and darker brick. The wider outside piers give the building a more solid appearance. The first floor serves as a base with Doric pilasters that support a simple entablature. The second floor is faced with unrelieved brick work and is pierced with paired windows on either side of a central group of three. A molded stringcourse divides the second floor from the upper floors. Above the second floor the piers are treated as pilasters that rise to a simple capital at the attic story. The spandrels between the windows on the upper floors are recessed, and at each floor they increase slightly in height. The attic story has a system of screened openings aligned with the windows below. The building is crowned by a projecting cornice and relieved finials above the corner piers.
