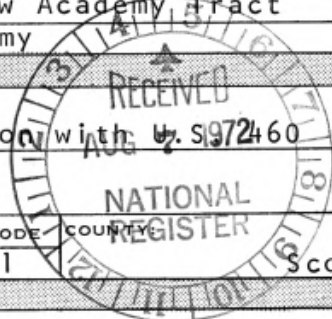

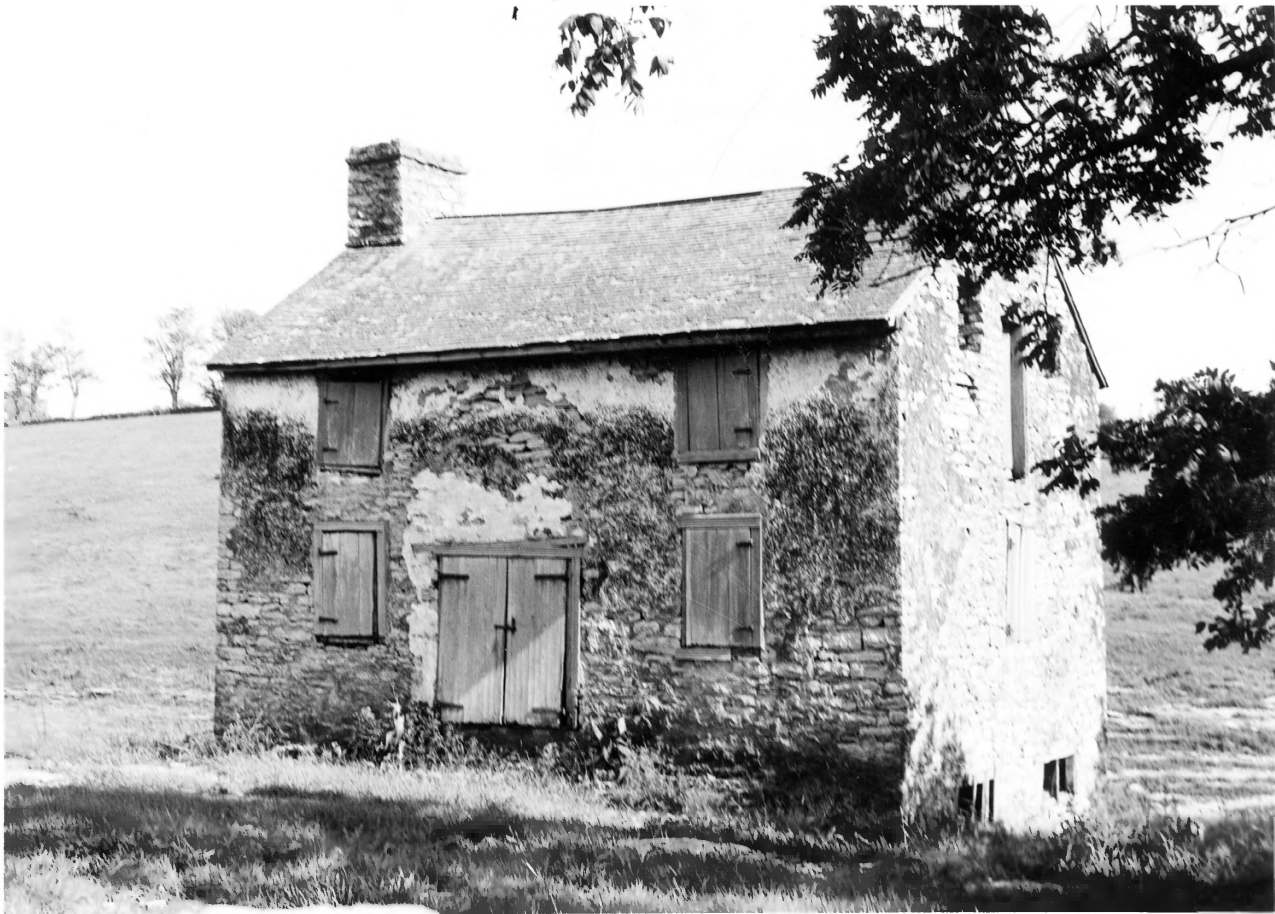
4. IDENTIFICATION

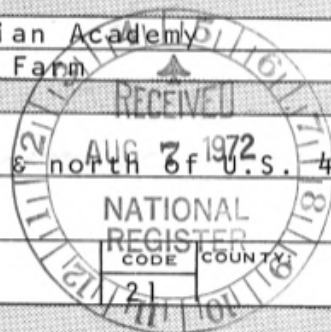

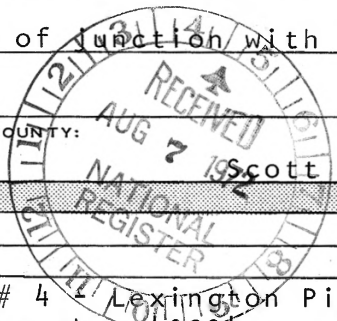

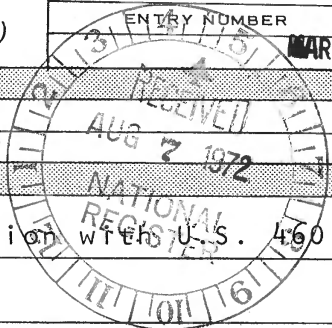

DESCRIBE VIEW, DIRECTION, ETC.
Showing the Blue Spring tract as seen from a high point slightly north of west, revealing the two main branches of Blue Spring flowing to a point just below the buildings where they join a 3rd and smaller spring. The stone building in center is the remaining building of Choctaw Academy. At right is framehouse which replaced the older brick home of Richard M. Johnson. Not visible, but further right and down the incline is the two room slave house.
