Describe present and historic physical appearance.

Located 7.0 miles southeast of Barneston, the Mission Creek Bridge spans Mission Creek in a rural Gage County setting that has changed little since the structure's period of significance. Other than maintenance-related repairs, the bridge remains essentially unaltered as it continues to carry vehicular traffic. The Mission Creek Bridge today retains a high degree of integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling and association. A description of the structure follows:

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations and areas of significance noted above.

This bridge was one of 28 bridges the Gage County Commissioners ordered constructed on July 20, 1898. The Youngstown Bridge Company of Youngstown, Ohio, had the annual contract to construct the county's bridges that year.

The Mission Creek Bridge is technologically significant as one of the three oldest of 32 small, steel, rigid-connected Warren pony trusses of a type found only in Gage County. They are characterized by a relatively lightweight superstructure and a rare suspended U-bolt connection of the floor beams to the superstructure. The Youngstown Bridge Company of Youngstown, Ohio was the first company to build these bridges in Gage County.
