
## **Historic Sites Survey**

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: NAME: The building at 1410 Bowen Avenue is a one story, wood frame, L-shaped STREET NO: 1410 Bowen Avenue "shotgun" house which is set on low brick piers and is covered by a cross TOWN/VIC: Ocean Springs gable roof. The body of the house consists of a north-to-south file of rooms across the southern end of which is a rear wing. A wrap-around gal-COUNTY: Jackson lery extends across the two-bay north facade of the rear wing and main BLOCK/LOT: block and along the western elevation of the latter. The gallery, which is undercut along the side and rear sections, projects from the main facade PRESENT OWNER: Alice Davidson Hire ADDRESS 1410 Bowen Ave., Ocean Springs, MS and is covered by a hip roof. This creates a gable on hip roof arrangement, the gable of which is pierced by a lozenge-shaped, louvered ventilator and PRESENT USE: clad in imbricated shingles. The porch is supported by chamfered posts residence residence FORMER USE: with sawn brackets. One of the three entrances from the gallery has a transom. The windows have six-over-six double-hung sash. DATE: ca. 1900 STYLE: Queen Anne ALTERATIONS: unknown ARCH/BUILDER: Rear porch enclosure SOURCE OF DATE: style OUTBUILDINGS: ENVIRONMENT: residential garage (moved), prefabricated aluminum storage shed, attached LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE carport **NEIGHBORHOOD** LANDSCAPE FEATURES: LOCAL X STATE Open lawn with some foundation plantings and pecan trees NATIONAL PHOTOS STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: The house at 1410 Bowen Avenue is architecturally significant in the history of Ocean Springs as an example of an architecturally-developed "shotgun" house which possesses a very high level of integrity. Although other examples of the "shotgun" form have survived in Ocean Springs, this house is noteworthy because its particulary extensive gallery which occupies approximately one fourth of the total area of the house. The building is also unique in the restraint of its simplified Queen Anne Style ornamentation.
