

The nominated property occupies city lots 25 and 26 of block and is roughly 120' x 120' in size. The boundary includes the entire city lots that have historically been associated with the property.

Contributing: 3 buildings

45. Description and House Plan:

The simply formed <u>house</u> consists of a small-scaled two-room block with a central passage and, in the original ell, a single room. The window and door surrounds are original, as are the 1/l double-hung sash windows. The cornice returns on the three gable-ends, and the brackets are grouped in pairs. The interior features woodwork with bull's eye corner blocks and a metal mantel that is marbleized, including inlay-style panels painted black and gold. The ceilings have been dropped, and the walls are paneled.

The 1920s-1930s addition in the angle of the ell has a more recent concrete block foundation. The front porch, too, is a recent addition--there does not seem to have been a porch originally.

Two small outbuildings downhill from the end of the ell are a <u>tool shed</u> and a <u>privy</u>, both of wood frame construction, both clad in tongue-in-grove, vertical-board siding, and both roughly contemporary with the house. The <u>privy</u> is gabled, while the <u>tool shed</u>, built in two stages, is shed-roofed. Both are roofed with standing-seam metal. The two outbuildings contribute to the significance of the house because they illustrate the domestic need for outbuildings in the period.

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
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
