Born 1685 - 1890 in Scotland.

Removed from County Down

Ireland to America in 1730.

Settling near Charlotte, N.C.

1743-45 where he died about

1751-60 and was buried in the

family burying ground near his

residence, 300 yards south of the

present site of Elizabeth College.

On this spot (1806) stood the

first brick building.

At the tombstones of this site

the old ground nearly disappeared

and his residence is now a

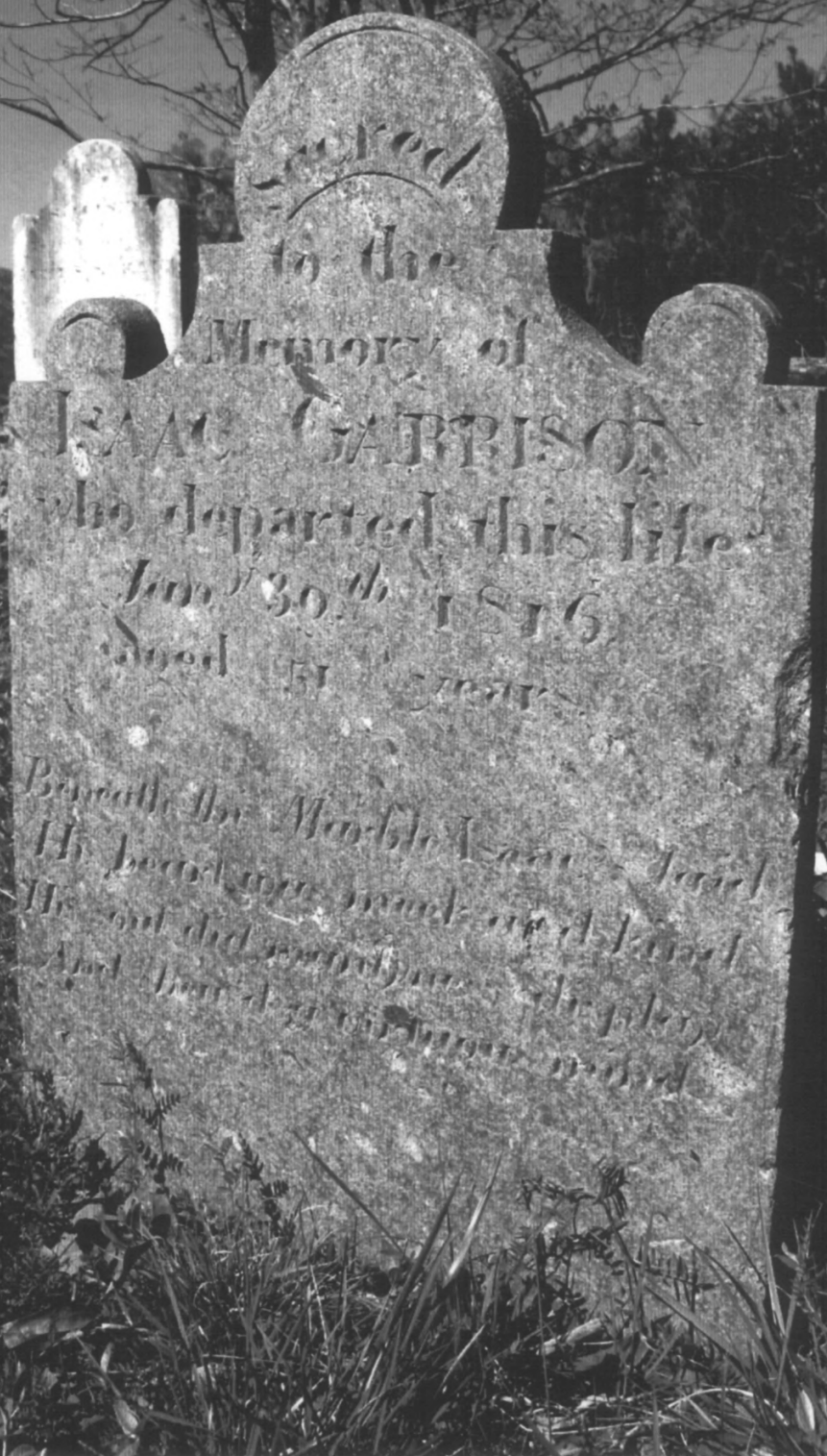
