

18. Description <u>Two-story, three-bay stone dwelling built into hillside. Front elevation exhibits a raised center passage & two rectangular basement windows. One of the more interesting features on this house is the use of arched stone voussoirs over the flat wooden lintels. Other details include a small attic vent in the gable end and original stone leanto at the right rear elevation. Frame room in corner appears to be an addition.</u> (Continue on Back)		34. 19. History <u>The 1883 Atlas of Campbell County indicates a dwelling on this site owned by J. Faha. John Faha is listed as the head of a household in the 1880 census. 20. Significance <u>An important embodiment of stone vernacular architecture along Four Mile & Tug Fork Creeks. The massing and fenestration of this house is very similar to the main block of the Riemer House (CP-55).</u>		36. Date <u>May 15, 1979</u>

19. 19 year old son were also born there. The fact that his 17 year old daughter was born in Kentucky suggests Faha came to Four Mile Creek c. 1861-1863. Stylistically the house is similar to other buildings constructed during the 1860-1870 period.



18. Six-over-six windows appear to be original features. Unusually deep gable roof has ribbed metal surface.

Between the house and Upper Tug Fork Road is a rectangular barn with raised limestone foundation. However, unlike most German bank barns, the main entrance is not on the upper level.

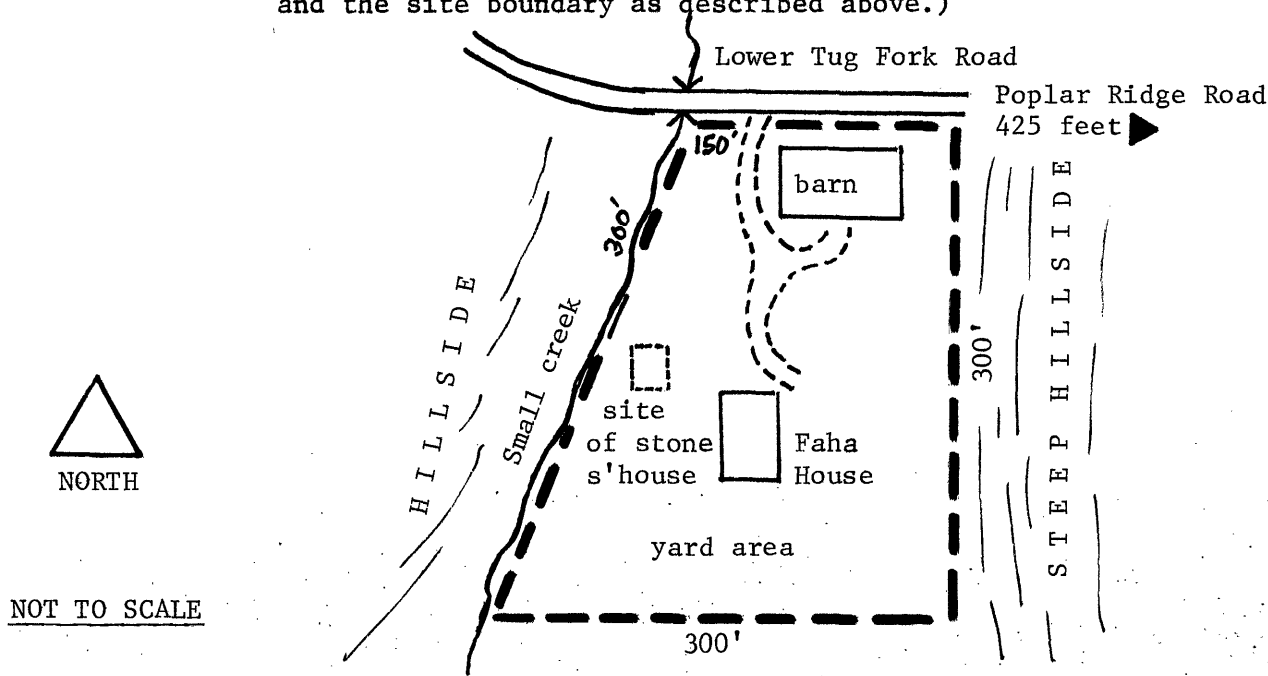

Verbal Boundary Description Acreage 1.55 acres

Beginning at a point on the south side of Lower Tug Fork Road which is 425' west of Poplar Ridge Road, proceed south 300' along the rear of Faha house and barn, then proceed west 300' to the Tug Fork Creek, then proceed northeast approximately 300' along said creek until reaching Lower Tug Fork Road. Then proceed 150' east to the point of origin. Boundaries include the stone house, barn, and yard area.
