DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

One of the most outstanding and probably the best maintained nineteenth century home in Brookings, South Dakota, is the Horace Fishback house at 501 8th Street. The Neo-Colonial style dwelling is 2-1/2 stories tall and built with clapboard siding, a cut stone foundation and wooden shingles on the roof. Almost square in shape, the house has symmetrically placed dormers on a truncated hip roof.

The front (south) facade features a portico consisting of a pediment supported by giant Ionic columns on bases. Within the portico is a balcony above the front door, which is a single leaf with an oval window. A transom and sidelights also enhance the main entrance. Other decorations include modillions beneath the eaves and around the pediment and a balustrade around the balcony. Leaded and beveled glass is seen in many windows of various shapes on the house. Large round-headed windows light the first floor livingrooms. A porte cochere extends from the west wall and an enclosed screened porch from the east facade.

No major alterations are evident on the exterior. A combination barn/garage building shares the lot with this stately home. All are in excellent condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE							

The Horace Fishback house has remained virtually as it was when constructed by the elder H. Fishback in 1895. No major alterations have marred either the interior or the exterior. The house has been in the Fishback family since its construction, and each occupant has been careful to maintain its integrity. The current Mrs. Fishback has retained many of the original furnishings and decorations, including egg and dart moulding and silk-covered walls. She opens her house to local clubs and college students for receptions and social gatherings.

The elder H. Fishback, who had the house built, was a partner in the Brookings County Bank, a private bank which in 1883 became the First National Bank. Almost a century has passed, but Fishbacks are still involved in local banking, and their home is still one of the most outstanding homes in Brookings.
