18. Description

Two-story structure of frame and shingles with multi-planed roof, a large gable, and a conical-roofed, hexagonal tower. A semi-elliptical lunette is placed high in the large front gable above a row of recessed windows. The round-arched former carriage entrance is still visible, although modified for residential use by the addition of large windows and a door.

19. History

Peter Lee Atherton built this large carriage house around 1901-03 after he bought the Woodside estate from John T. Bate. Atherton was also responsible for the Colonial Revival remodeling of the mid-19th-century house at Woodside. (See JF-534 attached) The carriage house was sold in 1951 to Warwick Anderson, a Louisville advertising executive, who adapted it for his residence.

20. Significance

The carriage house is significant as an excellent example of Shingle Style design. Built as part of an early 20th century country estate, the building is a reminder of the elaborate service buildings which were often erected on such estates in that era. (See also JF-534, JF-531, and Glenview Historic District.)

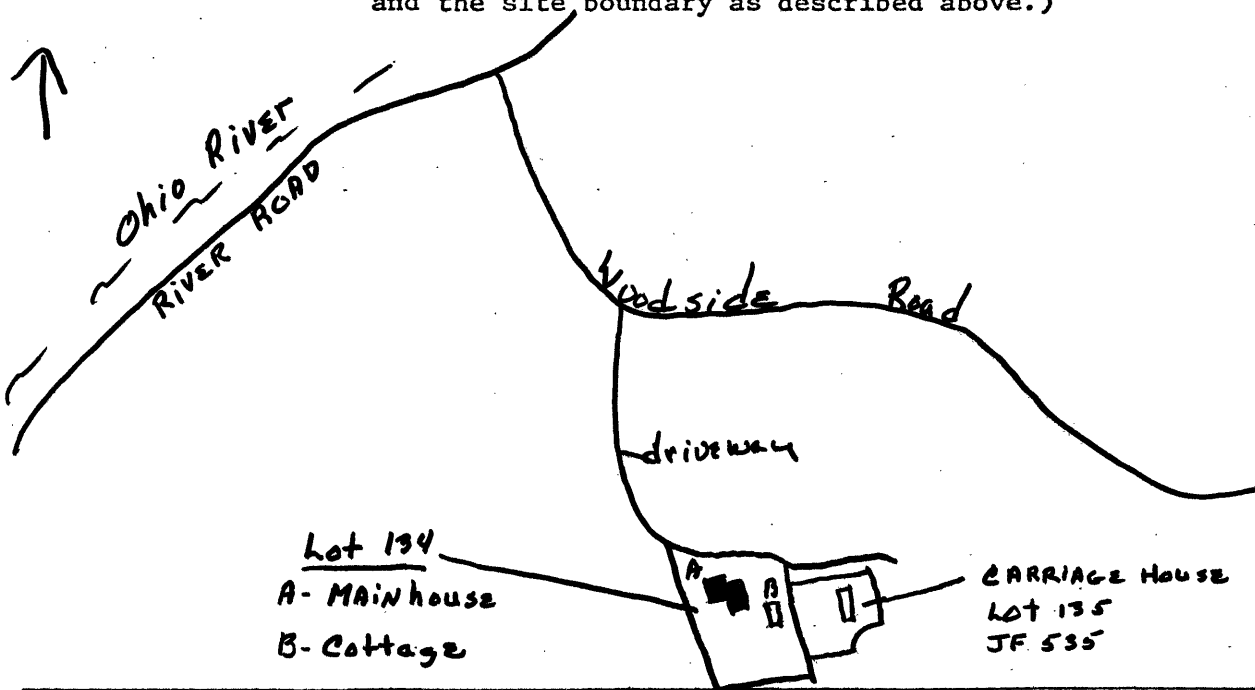
