openings reduced w common bond (photo 2)  
brick work. Common bonding on  
ends and rear; 4/4 second floor  
windows flanking chimneys on each  
end; W chimney interior, E chimney  
exterior. Front of house has 3 dormers -  
the center one is original, those on  
each side ca 1850-60; 20th C front  
porch. From exterior, brick house  
looks ca 1820, remodelled ca 1860.  
Interior not seen. Rear porch enclosed. Brick painted  
white.

Stone pitched to rear may have been  
1 story at one time - has 1 story of large  
white limestone, 2nd story common size (photo 3)  
grey limestone. One partially exterior  
chimney in N end. No evidence on  
exterior of date earlier than mid to  
late 19th C: Concrete pointing, grape-  
vine joints, narrow window frames, (photo 6)  
solid untoolled stone lintels. May  
have been remodelled also. Needs  
further inspection to clarify date.

House located on rise above  
Salt River to the N.E. Yard contains  
smoke house and root cellar. (photo 4)

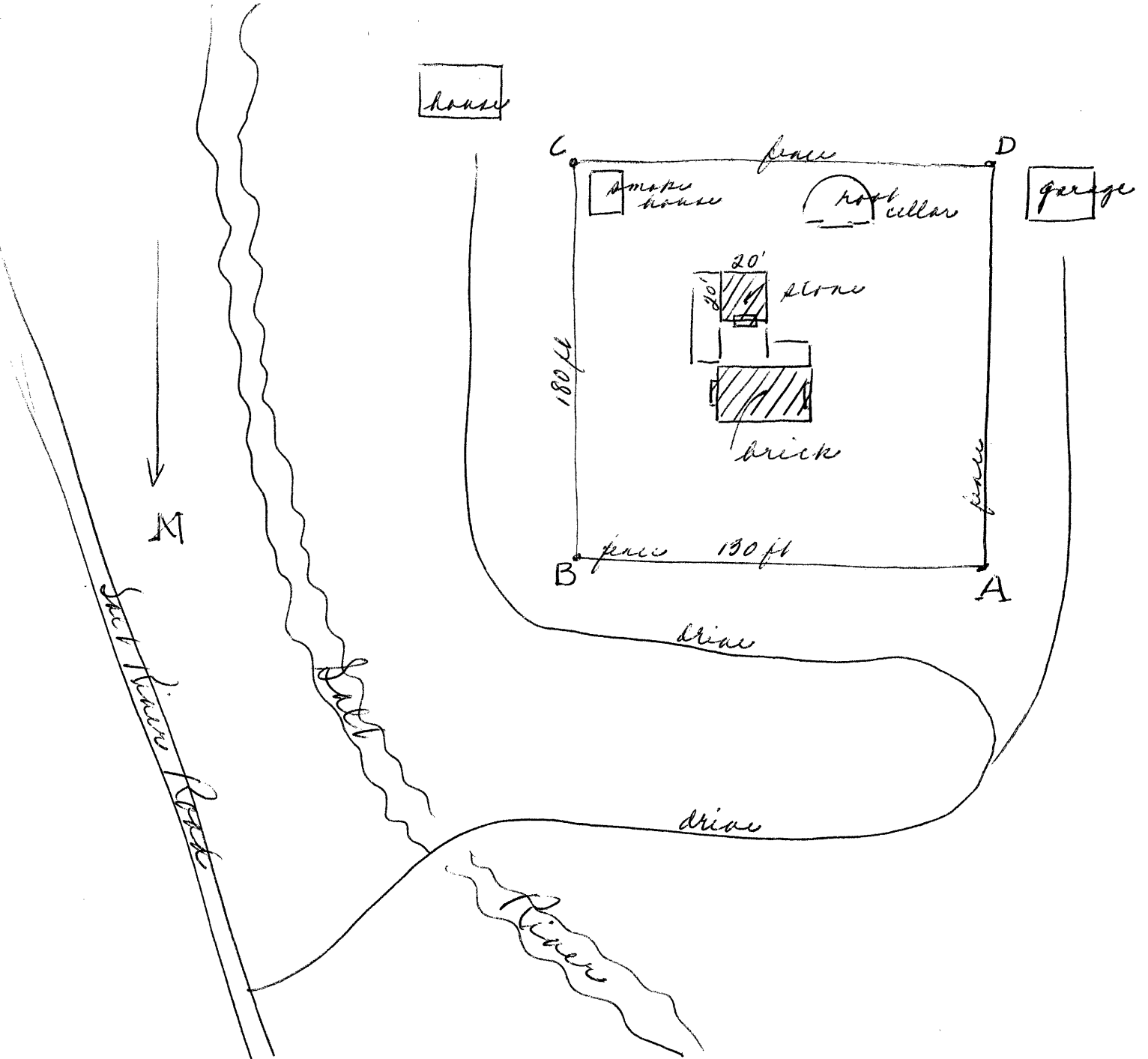

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A. at the NW corner of the yard, thence with fence around yard, E 130 ft to B, S 180 ft to C, W 130 ft to D, and N 180 ft to the beginning, containing the brick house, stone kitchen, smoke house and root cellar - about 3/4 acre.
