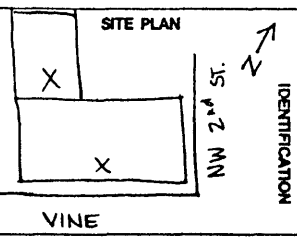

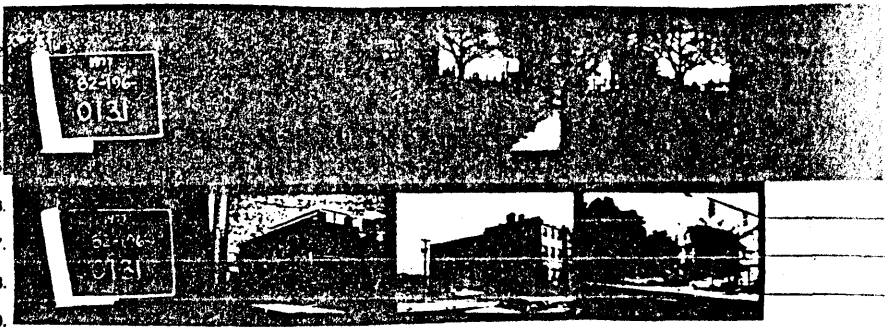

This Tudor Revival edifice was constructed in 1924-25 according to the designs drawn up by W. F. Thompson and Miss B. G. Geary of New York. The Evansville newspapers boasted that the brick specified for the building (manufactured by the Standard Brick Company of Evansville) was made using wooden molds much in the same way as in 15th century Tudor England. The cost of the structure was announced to be \$200,000. The contractors were the respected local firm of Anderson and Veatch. Aside from any architectural significance, the association with the YWCA, an important benevolent institution, adds standing to this particular building.
