stone lintels (as at Henson house, #d 42), well bonded, flat mortar joints w painted white line (pencil joint), pegged frames. no trim. 6/6 windows in attic between chimneys, 2 story porch w shed roof on W side of ell, dormer in W slope of ell roof, bellote w bell at S end of ell. Double stairs removed from center hall early 20th C, peg rail remains in kitchen, brick extension on interior end ell chimney.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at a fence corner in SE corner of yard at lane, thence along lane 500 ft <sup>W</sup> to B, thence at right angle 400 ft N to C, thence parallel to A-B 500 ft E to C, thence parallel to B-C 400 ft S to the beginning containing the stone dwelling house, <sup>frame dependency</sup> brick wash house and spring - about 4 1/2 acres. Barns are of later date.
