ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: foundation. Front facade is asymmetric with double door entry located in an extended pavilion. A large 1/1 sash double hung window with bracketed cornice window head is repeated irregularly on each side of pavilion. Pavilion is banded with a continuous entablature below a cornice supported by massive modillions that have matching larger brackets at each corner. In the tympanum is a lunette with louvers and a hood mould. The south pavilion is similar with a single door and transom flanked by 2 shuttered ornate windows. On the 2nd level of the pavilion is a variation of palladio window with multi-colored geometric stained glass. In the side of the pavilion is an intermediate level stained glass arched window with a hood mould. The corner boards of the house are decorated at the architrave with a cut out design. Level lot in transitional neighborhood with many large ornamental plants and trees. Good condition.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE: E. Eugene Hollis (a commercial traveler) and his wife, Marie are listed here with the Garretts. In 1910 Garrett sold to Osborn and Minnie Bullock. Bullock, at this time, was president of William Beach Hardware Co., and vice-president of Merchants of Mechanics Bank, two local business establishments. Bullock's daughter presently resides here.
