7. Description

The Royal Arms Apartments (originally named the Quinlan Castle) is located at 2030 Ninth Avenue, South in the Five Points Area of Birmingham. The complex has two connected buildings of three floors and a basement in each. These buildings are separated by a courtyard and together contain 72 apartment units. Built c. 1927, it is a rough stone and stucco structure of a pseudo-medieval castle design. Exterior features include heavy wood entrance doors with decorative iron hinges, a battlemented parapet, and four octagonal turrets. Most of the building's original casement windows have been replaced with inappropriate aluminum windows of a plain design.

Interior corridors feature the original tile floors, in good condition, stairways with iron and wood handrails, and rough finished plaster walls and ceilings. Portions of the walls and ceilings are moisture damaged and deteriorating. Corridors are dingy and lighting is poor. Some corridors are used as laundry areas with dryers vented through the windows.

Apartment interiors are modest and without any elaborate wood trim. Walls and ceilings are plaster. Walls in many apartments have paneling over the plaster. Floors are hardwood, but carpet has been installed. Bathrooms feature tile walls and floors, but along with the kitchens, need significant upgrading. Heating and cooling is provided through window units.

The Royal Arms has undergone no significant renovations and is structurally sound.

### Architecture, Criterion C

Quinlan Castle is an exceptional example of a 1920's Romantic Revival building. The Romantic Revival period glorified historic European architectural styles, and the medieval castellated design of this building represents the movement at its fanciful best. In addition to its unique style, Quinlan Castle is also exceptional as an example of an early, large, multilevel apartment complex. Such apartment buildings became widely popular for the first time during the late teens and twenties, and the Quinlan Castle complex is certainly one of Alabama's best examples of that period.
