

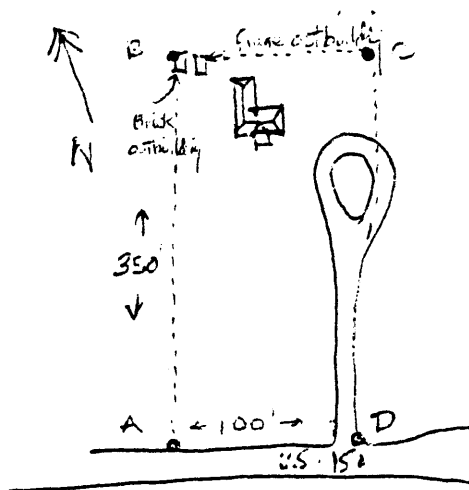

Verbal Boundary Description _____ Acreage 1 acre

Point A is located on the north side of the U.S. 150 right of way, 100 feet west of the point where the Thomas Hamilton house driveway enters U.S. 150. Beginning at Point A, proceeding north 350 feet to northwest corner of brick outbuilding at Point B on a line corresponding to the west wall of the outbuilding, thence 100 feet east on a line corresponding to the north wall of the outbuilding to Point C, thence 350 feet south along a line corresponding to the east side of a drive to Point D, thence west 350 feet to the point of origin, along the north side of U.S. 150. The boundaries were drawn to include the house, lawn, and domestic-related space defined by the location of outbuildings, drive and highway. One non-contributing frame outbuilding and one contributing brick outbuilding of unidentified original function are included. The nominated area contains two contributing buildings and one non-contributing building.
