Description of Mill Annex:

The Annex for the Alabama Builders` Hardware Manufacturing Company (more commonly known as the W.B. Davis Mill) is located southwest of the original mill complex (NRHP 5/8/86) across Franklin Street. Designed by J.E. Sirrine and Company, Engineers, of Greenville, North Carolina, the Annex is a three-story building with a full basement measuring approximately 197` X 62` and containing over 3200 square feet. The building is of heavy timber construction with load-bearing brick masonry exterior walls. The east facade displays 13 bays; the south facade displays 3 bays. These bays are visually separated by brick pilasters. 8`6" multipane projected steel windows fill the bays between the masonry pilasters. End bays display three, 15-light windows mulled together. Many of the lower level windows have been enclosed. The north facade has an original concrete loading dock and 6` wide concrete ramps; the south facade has a loading dock that was added in 1975. A tower containing the elevator and stair shafts is located on the west facade.

The original drawings of Engineers J.E. Sirrine and Company, Greenville, SC, dated April 4, 1927, indicate a flat roof supported by wood joists, beams and columns. This, however, was changed to the present lamella arch roof design at the time of construction. Prefabricated in Germany and assembled on the building under the supervision of W.Y. Shugart, Sr., the lamella roof is made up of relatively short timbers of uniform length called lamellas. Bevelled and bored at the ends and bolted together at an angle, the lamellas form a network of decorative structural timber. In making this change, the entire building was provided with an automatic sprinkler system and automatically closing firedoor, so as to conform with the requirements of the National Board of Fire Underwriters.

The first and second floors are 3" thick (2" thick pine subfloor and 1" X 4" tongue-ingroove random length boards) on 4" X 14" maple wood joists spanning 15 feet. The wood joists span 15` and are placed onto 12" X 14" wood beams supported by 7" diameter cast-iron columns 20` on centers. The basement floor is 5" thick finished concrete. The floor to ceiling heights are: 9` basement; 14` first floor; and 18` second floor at the apex of the roof. Much of the interior space is open and now used for storage.

Criterion A (Industry):

The Annex for the Alabama Builders` Hardware Manufacturing Company complex (W. B. Davis Hosiery Mill) is significant for its associations with the growth and revival of industrial development in Fort Payne during the early 20th century. Locally recognized as the primary training facility for many of the local hosiery and sock manufacturers, it also served as a major impetus for the local expansion of this industry which has earned Fort Payne the title of "Sock Capitol of the World." Originally known as the Alabama Builders` Hardware Manufacturing Company, the plant was acquired in the early 1900s by W.B. Davis, a successful hosiery manufacturer from Chattanooga. It became the principal workplace for many living in or around Fort Payne.

With the rapid expansion of the mill, the W.B. Davis company constructed another building in 1927. The "New Mill" or W.B. Davis Hosiery Mill Annex was used for manufacturing and housed the Banner Knitting machines. It was connected to the original building by underground walkways. In 1974, the mill annex was opened as a commercial cabinet shop. Current plans for the building include converting it into loft-style apartments.

Although the Annex is a contributing building to the mill complex, it was inadvertently not included in the Alabama Builders` Hardware Manufacturing Company (W.B. Davis Hosiery Mill) National Register nomination (listed 05/08/86).
