DESCRIPTION The 1905 DeJong House is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story, L-shaped gable structure with clapboard facing and two single stack chimneys. The front facade features a hip roof porch in the angle of the L, with bracketed columns, turned top rail, and a lattice-enclosed crawl space underneath. Gable ends feature one rectangular one over one operning on each story, with the south facade also a second opening on the first story. The rear facade fenestration is rectangular two sash over two sash. Also incorporated into the front facade is a gable wall dormer in the top half-story over one of the doors.

STYLE Vernacular-L-shaped Victorian DATE 1905

SIGNIFICANCE

The 1905 DeJong House is architecturally significant because it illustrates part of the development of the L-shaped vernacular style typical of the resource area.
