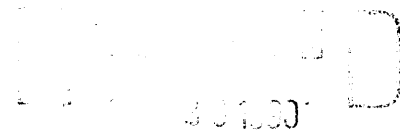

The William Phillips House is a one-and-one-half story, five bay, central passage plan residence built ca. 1820. The house is located in a rural section of the county west of Hodgenville and is sited on a small rise adjacent to Barren Run Creek. There are no outbuildings associated with the property's period of significance.

The William Phillips House has a brick foundation, gable roof of asphalt shingles, interior end brick chimneys, and an exterior of five course common bond brick. At the rear is a one-story frame ell added ca. 1900. The entrance on the main facade was altered ca. 1920 with the addition of brick panels and a glass and wood door. This entrance retains its original wood lintel with corner blocks displaying diamond wood panels. Window openings retain their original wood lintels with diamond panel corner blocks but the windows themselves are ca. 1920 three-over-one vertical light sash. At the roofline is a corbelled brick cornice.

The rear ell was added ca. 1900 and has weatherboard siding, glass and wood paneled doors, and one-over-one wood sash and three-over-one vertical wood sash windows. On the east facade is an incised porch with added screen and glass panels. The interior of the original section retains its original woodwork and detailing. This consists of four and five paneled doors, architrave molding around the windows, and built-in closets and cupboards. The staircase retains its original newel post with a cap and ball design and round balusters. Mantles are Federal influence with fluted Doric pilasters.

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PROPERTY TYPE: Rural Residence, 1820-1860

The William Phillips House is a notable example of an early 19th century central passage plan residence with Federal detailing. The house is one of only four brick ante-bellum structures remaining in Larue County and it retains much of its original interior and exterior form and plan. The house is sited on a slight rise overlooking Barren Run Creek and has integrity of site and setting.

This residence was built for Colonel William Phillips who purchased 258 acres of land along Barren Run in 1817. Phillips moved to Larue County from Nashville, Tennessee and had this one-story brick residence constructed ca. 1820. Phillips had served in the War of 1812 and fought at the Battle of New Orleans. Upon moving to Larue County, Phillips farmed for a number of years before moving west to Arkansas where he died and is buried. His land passed into the hands of his son, Philip Purdy Phillips who resided at the house until the 1870s. Purdy sold the property to Taylor Watkins who in turn sold the property to Charles and Laura Duell in 1881. The Duell family has owned the property for over 100 years and continue to farm the land along Barren Run.

Despite alterations to the doors and windows, the William Phillips House retains much of its original character. The interior detailing and design is especially intact and the house is one of the oldest brick residences in the county.

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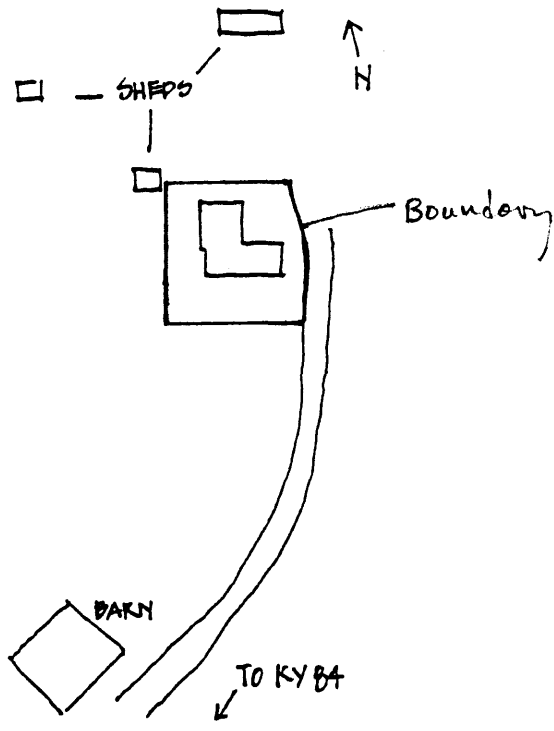

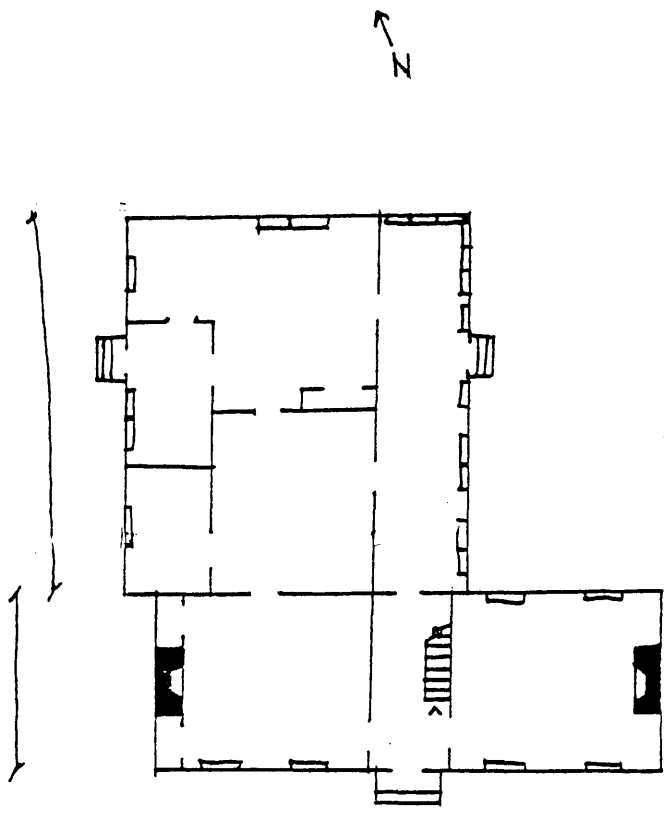
Verbal Boundary Description: The boundary for the William Phillips House is shown as the heavy black line on accompanying Larue County tax map 14, parcel 3, which is drawn at a scale of 1" = 660'.

Boundary Justification: The boundary for the William Phillips House includes the house and a section of fenced adjacent yard around the house. Excluded are modern outbuildings to the north of the residence. The boundary includes all structures associated with the property's period of significance.
